H E following Address having been transmitted by his Grace the Duke of Devonshire', Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, one of his Majestry's Principal Se-cretary's of State, has by him been prefented to his Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very gracioully.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Lord Mayor, A Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens of the City of Dublin.

May it please your Majesty, WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons and Citizens of the City of Dub lin, most humbly beg Leave to congratulate your Majesty on your happy Return to your British Dominions.

When the utgent Affairs of State demand your Majefty's Preferce Abroad, our Anxiery for your, Majefty's Welfare is equal to the Duty which the most grateful reople owe the best of Princes, and can only be compenfated by the foy we feel on your Majesty's fafe Arrival.

May Heaven crown your Majesty's Arms with Success in the just and necessary War, undertaken for the Protection of the Trade of your Majefty's Dominions; and may an honourable and lafting Peace enfue.

But if an unforescen Event should occasion" any Diffurbance, we beg Leave to allure your Majesty, that we are ready to hazard even our Lives in Support of your Majesty, and of the Protestant Succession in your illustrious House.

In Teffimony whereof, we have cauled the common Seal of the faid City to be hereunto affixed the Tenth Day of November, in the Year of our Lord One thouland feven hundred and forty one.

This Day His Majesty came to the House of Peersy and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Charles Dalton, Gentleman Ufher of the

Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houle of Conmons, commanding their Attendance in the Houle of Peers: The Commons being come thithen accordingly, His Majesty's Pleasure was signified to them by the Lord Chancellor, that they fhould return to their House and chuse a Speaker, and prefent him to His Majefty on Friday the 4th Instant. They returned ac-cordingly, and unanimously chose the Right. Honourable Arthur Onflow, Efq; to be their Speaker,

Meffina, Ottober 30, N.S. On the z4th Instant arrived here from Naples, in feven Days, a Maltefe Ship under Neapolitan Colours, and a Neapolitan one, both hired by his sicilian Majeity, to carry back to Con-ftantinople the Junkuh Amballador, who, with his Retinue, is on board the Maltefe; and on the other the Chevalier Majo, his Sicilian Majefty's Ambaffador to the Grand. This Ambaslador, whose Name is Hallen Estendi, on his landing was saluted from the Cittadel with Fifteen Guns, and again at his embarking Yefterday in the Af-ternoon, with the like Number; and, during his Stay here, was lodged and entertained by the Prince of Villafranca.

Naples, Nov. , N. S. Upon the Arrival of the Weekly Spanish Courier to this Court, a Report was spread, that an Expedition of about 15000 Men, under Direction of M. de Montemar, was failed from Barcelona. This Expedition, 'tis faid, is to be followed by another Body of acooo Men likewife from Barcelona, and joined by a Body of Neapolitan Troops, viz. Ten Battallions out of the Foot Regiments, the Queen, Enaut, Anvers, and Guidi, eight Companies of the Italian and Swils Guards, fome Companies of Gunners, and fome Squadrons of Cuiraffiers and Dragoons.
