Vienna, December 23, N. S. The last Journal from the Queen of Hungary's Army in Bohemia, of the 20th Instant at Wittingau, gives an Account, that the French, Bavarians and Saxons having formed a considerable Body to penetrate into Moravia, and raise Contributions and take Winter-Quarters there, Prince Lobcowitz assembled hastily 15 or 16,000 Men, and made such Dispositions, that the Allies thought fit to postpone their Design at least, and retired after having had a few Men killed by the Hungarian Hussars. The Allies have likewise attempted to find out a Passage into Upper Austria by the Mountains in the Bishoprick of Passaw, but found it impracticable. Their Head Quarters are at Frauenberg. On the 18th a Detachment of Hussars having passed the Moldaw near Budeweis, came up with a whole Company of French Grenadiers, which they partly killed, and partly made Prisoners. Count Khevenhuller, at his Arrival at St. Pulten, assembled a Council of War of all the Generals who are to serve under him; after which he proceeded Yesterday Morning for Waidhoffen, the general Rendezvous of his Troops.

Vienna, Dec. 27, N. S. The last Journal from the Army in Bohemia, is of the 25th Instant, N. S. and imports, That on the 23d his Royal Highness went to Budeweis with a considerable Body of the Army, where they passed the Moldaw with the Artillery, and marched on the 24th in two Columns to Wodnian,



Wodnian, a little Town surrounded with Walls; wherein a Bavarian Captain, with 170 Soldiers, defended himself till in the Night, when they saved themselves, except 45 of them, which our Hussars took Prisoners when they entered the Town. We march To-morrow to Piseck, to dislodge the Enemies from thence. We have had but four Hussars killed or wounded at Wodnian. Prince Lobcowitz's separate Body has been reinforced with several Regiments, to put him in a Condition to watch the Saxons and Bavarians in Moravia and in that Neighbourhood. There is no News as yet from Count Khevenhuller's Army in Upper Austria; but as he will now have received all his Artillery and Pontons, it is hoped he will soon begin his Operations. Count Colorado sets out as this Day for Mentz. The Report about Steyr seems to be contradicted, and to have been only founded upon the Intelligence of a neighbouring Prelate, who took the Exchanging of the French for a Bavarian Garrison, to be the Retreat of the Enemy and the Entrance of the Austrians into that Place.

Hambourg, Jan. 5. According to Advices from Francfort, the 24th Instant, N. S. is the Day appointed for the Election of an Emperor.

Dublin, December 23.

This Day his Grace the Lord Lieutenant went to the House of Peers with the usual Solemnity, and the Commons being sent for up, gave the Royal Assent to the following Bills, viz.

An Act for granting and continuing to his Majesty an additional Duty on Beer, Ale, Strong-Waters, Wine, Tobacco, and other Goods and Merchandizes herein mentioned.

An Act for granting to his Majesty a further additional Duty on Wine, Silk, Hops, China, Earthen, Japanned or Lacquered Ware, and Viegear; and also a Tax of Four Shillings in the Pound on all Salaries, Profits of Employments, Fees and Pensions, to be applied to pay an Interest of Four Pounds per Cent. per Annum, upon the Sum of One hundred twenty five thousand Pounds, Part of the Sum of Three hundred thousand Pounds; and an Interest of Five Pounds per Cent. per Annum, upon such Part of the Residue thereof, as shall remain unpaid on the 25th Day of December, 1741, and also to pay an Interest of Four Pounds per Cent. per Annum, upon a further Sum not exceeding the Sum of One hundred twenty-five thousand Pounds to be borrowed for the Purposes herein mentioned, and towards the Discharge of the said principal Sums.
