His Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in his Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Charles Dalton, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Messlage from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for continuing the Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, in that Part of Great

Britain called England; and for granting to his Majesty certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, for the Service of the Year 1742.

An Act to repeal so much of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for the Preservation of the publick Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England, as obliges Persons not travelling for Hire, to make use of Waggon with Wheels bound with Streaks, or Tyre of a certain Breadth, or the said Streaks to be fastened with Nails of a certain Size.

Petersbourg, January 2.

The following is a Proclamation published by the Czarina in order to her Coronation.

WE Elizabeth the First, by the Grace of God, Empress and Sovereign of all the Russias, make known to all our faithful Subjects, as well Ecclesiastical, as Military and Civil, and to all and every one.

No Body is ignorant, in what Manner, by a special Grace of the Almighty, the Source of all Good, We have, by the Right of Blood, and as the nearest Heir, ascended the Imperial Throne of all the Russias, which we have inherited from our August Father and Mother, and that by virtue of this happy Event, all our Subjects have, according to their Duty, taken an inviolable Oath of Fidelity as to their true and lawful Sovereign.

As the Word of God teaches us, that the Almighty holds in his Hand the Kingdoms of the Earth, that he disposes of them to whom he pleases, and that all the Monarchs of the Earth hold their supreme Power from that King of Kings, and Lord of Lords, which has given Occasion to the laudable and ancient Custom established amongst all Christian Sovereigns, of being crowned in Churches; We likewise in Imitation of our August Predecessors, and other crowned Heads, have resolved, with the Assistance, and by the Grace of God, to cause ourselves to be crowned, during the Celebration of Divine Service, and the usual Prayers on such Occasions, and to receive the Crown and other Marks of Sovereign Power, in our Capital City of Moscow in April next, acknowledging publicly that the Hereditary Right we have to the Sovereignty of this powerful Empire, comes to us from the Grace of the King of Kings, who disposes



disposes of Scepters and strengthens them, and for this purpose beg his Holy Blessing.

And to the End that our faithful Subjects, as well Ecclesiastical, as Military and Civil, and others, may be informed of our Pleasure, We have ordered the same to be published by printed Declarations, desiring at the same Time that all our Subjects should implore the Divine Blessing for our Preservation, for the happy Accomplishment of our Design, and the perpetual Tranquility of our Reign. Assuring further all our faithful Subjects of our Affection and Imperial Favour.

Hague, Feb. 9. We have received Advice here of the Surrender of Passau on the 25th past, and of the Austrian Forces having over-run the greatest Part of Bavaria, and raised vast Contributions; but as the Posts from the Empire come in so irregularly, we have as yet only very general Accounts of the Proceedings in those Parts. The News of Felt Marshal Topping's having been taken Prisoner is contradicted. It is said that the Elector Palatine is sending a Body of Troops for the Defence of Bavaria, and that the French are preparing to replace that under the Command of M. Segur, which is to return into France in pursuance of the Capitulation of Lintz.

Whitball, February 6.

By his Majesty's Ship the Suffolk, commanded by Captain Davers, arrived at Spithead from Jamaica, there is Advice, that Major General Wentworth, with the Forces under his Command, was returned, on the 9th of November last, to Port Royal in Jamaica, having found it necessary to withdraw them from the Island of Cuba, upon Account of the Sickness, which was increasing greatly amongst them.

And there are also Letters from Vice Admiral Vernon, dated the 10th of December, at which Time he was, with the Fleet, out upon a Cruize, in order to meet the Reinforcement expected from England.
