Petersbourg, January 12.

THE Placard, lately revoking all Grants and Graces since the Death of her late Majesty, was annulled the latter End of last Week.

Hambourg, Feb. 6. N. S. From Finland we hear, that the Swedish Army remains encamped at Seckjow, upon the Russian Territory; and that General Lowenhaupt obliges the adjacent Villages to furnish the necessary Provisions and Forage for his Army, without any Opposition on the Part of the Russians. On the 4th Instant the Cannon were fired from the Ramparts of this City, upon the Occasion of the Election of an Emperor, and Preparations are making for farther Rejoycings. The young Duke of Holstein was to be received at Riga with great Honours and Marks of Distinction. The Letters which came in this Afternoon from those Quarters make not any Mention of the late Regent's Family, but it is said here that they are arrived at Konigsberg. The Baron Osterman, Brother to the late Prime Minister of that Name, has passed Dantzick on his Way to Berlin: He resided, till the late Revolution, with the Character of Minister from the Duke of Mecklenburgh, at the Court of Petersbourg.

Dresden, Feb. 7, N. S. Yesterday Prince Charles's Regiment of Light Horse passed through here, when his Highness, though but eight Years old, put himself at the Head of it: It consists of about 600 Men, and is on its March from Lusatia to Bohemia. It is said that Lieutenant-General Sibilski's is to follow. Another Detachment of Uhlan Tartars are ordered from Poland to the Saxon Army.

Hague, Feb. 13, N. S. The Assembly of Holland opened this Morning, (To-morrow being set apart for a publick and solemn Fast) and is much more numerous than usual, most

of the Towns having sent, besides their ordinary Deputies, some extraordinary ones, chosen out of their leading Regents. We have now four Posts due from Vienna.

The King has been pleased to signify his Pleasure, by Warrant to the Right Hon. Francis Earl of Effingham, Deputy to his Grace Edward Duke of Norfolk, Earl Marshal and Hereditary Earl Marshal of England, that Mrs. Maria Walpole shall have and enjoy the same Place, Preeminence and Precedency in all Assemblies and Meetings whatsoever, as the Daughter of an Earl of the Kingdom of Great Britain.
