*Naples, March 20.*

ON the 15th, the Infant Don Philip's Birth-day was celebrated here with great Solemnity, the Foreign Ministers, Nobility and Military Officers were to pay their Duties to their Majesties on this Occasion, and in the Evening the Cannons of the Castles and Gallies were fired.

*Rome, March 24.* On the 17th the Maltese Ambassador, attended by many Knights of that Order, had a publick Audience of the Pope, in which he took his Leave. On the 19th the Prince of Mansfeld, Ambassador from the new Emperor, had an Audience of the Pope, to notify his Election to the Imperial Throne; and after Easter proposes, 'tis said, to set out hence to the Court of Naples on the said Message. The Articles of the Ecclesiastical Immunities between this Court and the King of Sardinia, have at last been signed and mutually approved of: The Pope has accordingly ordered the Bulls to be drawn up, in order to be sent to the King of Sardinia. Cardinal Tencin, who keeps his Apartment on Account of his Indisposition, has received Notice by the last Post, that the French King has conferred upon him the Order of the Holy Ghost. On the 18th two Battalions of the Walloon Guards began to extend from Pesaro to Rimini, and on the 20th were to be followed by others. The Horse was advanced to Forli.

*Leghorn, March 30.* On the 21st, the King of Sardinia and the Prince Hereditary of Piedmont, arrived at Placentia, where he has fixed his Head Quarter; his Troops have already entered Parma and Placentia, which have been evacuated by the Austrian Troops, they being advanced to Coreggio and Carpi, in the State of Modena. On the 22d Count Traun, Governor of Milan, set out from Parma to Placentia, to confer with his Sardinian Majesty. M. de Montemar, on Apprehension of a Surprise, has removed the great Magazines that had been prepared for the Spaniards in the Bolognese State to the Ferrarese, where it seems he designs to draw his Troops for the Conveniency of the Navigation of the Po. It is said, that the Artillery from Naples is to be landed at Pesaro, or near that Place. On the 24th a Battalion,

consisting of about 500 Men out of the Austrian Regiment of Wallis's Foot that were left in Tuscany, began their March from hence by the Lunigiana, to join their Regiment in Lombardy.

*Florence, April 1.* On the 26th past, a Party of Spanish Troops passed near the Walls of this City, on their March from la Spezia, to join the Spanish Army in the Ecclesiastical State. The same Day a Courier from the Court of Vienna (who left Dispatches in Lombardy for the King of Sardinia and M. Traun) passed through this City for Rome, with Dispatches for the Queen of Hungary's Minister. This Courier left also Dispatches from the Great Duke to Prince Craon. On the 29th past, a Body of about 300 Spanish Deserters, who had entered into the Great Duke's Service, and were clothed with the Regimentals of the Lorrain Foot-Guards, were sent to Leghorn by the Arno. Parties of Deserters out of the Spanish Army continue daily to arrive here from the Romagna.

*Vienna, April 3.* The 3000 Croatinas, who returned to their Families some Time ago, upon the Promise of being here as the 1st of this Month, are come accordingly, and are assigned to Prince Charles at Znaim. The Rendezvous of the whole Body designed to act in Moravia, is appointed for the 7th Instant. It is publicly reported, that Marshal Konigseck will join Prince Charles at Znaim. Marshal Khevenhuller is at Pfaffenhoven upon the Ilm.

*Hamburg, April 13.* A Letter from Stockholm of the 3d Instant mentions, that a Courier was arrived there from Finland, who had, by Reason of the Ice, been obliged to take his Route by Torne, with the News of the Hostilities having been renewed on the Part of the Russians; and that two Days afterwards a second Express brought Advice, that the Avant-Guard of General Lowenhaupt's Army being attacked and extremely harassed by the frequent Excursions of the Enemy's Cossacks, he had dispatched Colonel Lagerkrantz to Petersbourg, to complain of what had passed, and to endeavour to procure a Renewal of the Suspension of Arms, which was thought the more necessary at Stockholm, as the Frost makes it still impracticable to send any Reinforcement of Troops to Finland.

By Letters from Vice-Admiral Vernon and Major-General Wentworth, of the 11th of February, there is Advice, that Captain Lawes, with the Convoy and Transports under his Command, arrived at Jamaica the 15th of January; and that his Majesty's Forces, who came with the said Convoy, being in good Condition, and those before upon the Island greatly recovered, they were preparing, with all possible Dispatch, to put to Sea upon a new Expedition.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Charles Brown, Esq; to be principal Officer of the Navy for the Affairs of his Majesty's Yards at Chatham and Sheerness, in the room of Thomas Mathews, Esq; who is appointed Vice-Admiral of the Red Squadron of his Majesty's Fleet.

James Steuart, Esq; and Sir Charles Hardy, are appointed Rear-Admirals of the Blue Squadron of his Majesty's Fleet.

Whitehall, April 10.

Whereas on Sunday the 4th Instant, about Two of the Clock in the Morning, five Men mounted on Horseback, loaded with Goods, suspected to be Tea, passing through the Road near Clerkenwell Green, one of their Horses run against the Constable, who holding up his Staff to defend himself, the Person on the said Horse discharged divers Pistols or Blunderbusses at the said Constable and his Watchman Isaac Crawley, and wounded the said Crawley in his Arm, which has since been cut off: And whereas another of the said Persons returning back, fired four Pistols or Blunderbusses at the said Constable and his Watchman; and soon after divers Persons came to the Watch-house at Clerkenwell Green, and discharged several Pistols or Blunderbusses through the Door of the said Watch-house, and wounded Richard Croxall, another Watchman there on his Duty, who is since dead. For the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned, his Majesty is pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any two of the Offenders who shall first discover their Accomplices (the Person who first fired at and wounded Isaac Crawley excepted) so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a further Encouragement for such Discovery, the Person or Persons so discovering shall receive a Reward of Fifty Pounds for each Offender who shall be apprehended and convicted; to be paid by the Commissioners of his Majesty's Customs on the Conviction of such Offender or Offenders.

N. B. The Person who first discharged the Pistols or Blunderbusses at the Constable, and his Watchman, was a Lusty Man, about Forty Years of Age, of a Swarthy Complexion, pitted with the Small Pox, and had on a Wig of a Darkish Colour, a Light Coloured Duffel Coat, and a Great Coat over it, and the Horse or Horses he rode on was of a large Size, of a dark Bay Colour, with Cropt Ears, the Saddle he rode on, which was dropt from the Horse, is a brown Leather Saddle, with four Staples, and two Leather Straps,

such as are frequently used by the Smugglers, with a Woollen Saddle Cloth, Chequ'd with Blue and White, with one Girt and a Surcingle, and another of the said Persons, who returned back and fired upon the Constable and his Watchman, rode on a large black Horse, was a lusty Man in a light Colour'd Great Coat, and another of the Horses was a spotted Horse with a Bald Face.
