

Hambourg, June 22. The Imperial Minister Count Bunaw, meets with great Difficulties in his Negotiation here with Regard to the Free Gift to the Emperor, and to the appropriating a House in this City to the Use of the Emperor's Minister for the free Exercise of the Roman Catholick Religion.

Dresden, June 24, N. S. What we hear from Bohemia is, that the French Army remains at Prague, and had received most of the Recruits they expected. Prince Charles was the 18th at Pilsen, and march'd from thence the Day following for Rokitzau and Manth, with an Intention, as was believed, to proceed to Prague.

'Tis also required, that the said Certificates be sent by the General Post only, directed To the Right Hon. Henry Pelham, Esq; Pay Master General of his Majesty's Land Forces, at the Horse Guards, London. And 'tis hereby further notified, that no one will be entered on the Pay Book of the said Hospital, or be thought entitled to the said Pension, that shall neglect making their Appearance, or sending Certificates, as before directed.
