In the mean time every thing was prepared for the Siege of the Citadel of Modena, and the Trenches were to be opened before that Fortress on the 9th.

Parma, June 9, N. S. The Prince Royal of Savoy is arrived in the Territories of this State with a Body of Piedmontese and Swiss Troops, in order to join the King his Father. They write from Mantua, that 3000 Croats are arrived there from Germany, and that they immediately expect 600 Rascians, all of them cloathed

in the Turkish Manner.

Florence, June 17. The Spanish and Neapolitan Armies remain in their Encampments: There is a strong Probability however, that they will foon either attempt an Action, or remove into the Ferrarese, as they cannot longer subsist in the Bolognese for Want of Forage. On the 10th a Picket of Spanish Dragoons deserted when on Duty at their Bridge over the River Reno. A few Days ago a Train of 16 large Cannon from Ancona arrived at the Spanish Camp along the River Muzza.
