ceived the necessary Pallports, have actually paifed through the Auftrian Army in their Way to Venice. The Princefles are retired to the Convent of St. Francis de Sales, and the Hereditary Prince, with the Princess his Confort, are gone to Carrara, the King of Sardinia having fent the Baron de Carpenels to Sasluolo, to assure the Duke that his Majesty would never permit the least Injury to be done to the Ducal Family of Modena. In the mean time every thing was prepared for the Siege of the Citadel of Modena, and the Trenches were to be opened before that Fortress on the 9th.

Parma, June 9, N. S. The Prince Royal of Savoy is arrived in the Territories of this State with a Body of Piedmontefe and Swifs Troops, in order to join the King his Father. They write from Mantua, that 3000 Croats are arrived there from Germany, and that they immediately expect 600 Rafcians, all of them cloathed in the Turkish Manner.

Florence, June 17. The Spanish and Nea-politan Armies remain in their Encampments: There is a strong Probability however, that they will foon either attempt an Action, or remove into the Ferrarefe, as they cannot longer fubfift in the Bolognese for Want of Forage. On the toth a Picket of Spanish Dragoons deferted when on Duty at their Bridge over the River Reno. A few Days ago a Train of 16 large Cannon from Ancona arrived at the Spanish Camp along the River Muzza.

Vienna, June 13, N. S. The Queen will appear in Publick, for the first Time, after her lying in, on Sunday or Monday next, and will fet out a few Days afterwards for the Caftle of Schonbrunn.

Vienna, June 20. By Letters which came in this Day at Noon, and dated at Pilfenetz in Bohemia, there is Advice that the main Army is between Pilsen and Beraun, about 10 Leagues from Prague, that the French who first entered Prague, were in fuch hafte as to fhut the Gates upon those of their own Body who lag'd, and that they have passed cross the Town to this Side of the Mulda.

Dresden, June 26. Prince Charles is faid to be arrived with his whole Army within half a German Mile of Prague

Breflaw, June 25. We hear that the Peace between the King of Pruffia and Queen of Hungary, was proclaimed at his Pruffian Majefty's Head Quarters by Sound of Trumpet and Kettle-Drums, in Prefence of all the General and Field Officers affembled for that Purpofe; and that as foon as the King of Pruffia received the Queen of Hungary's Ratification of the Preliminary Articles, his Majesty ordered his Army to hold themfelves in Readinefs to march in three Bodies, one towards Silefia, another towards Brandenburg through Luface, he having previoufly asked Leave of the King of Poland, and the third Body towards Westphalia, and that they are already all three upon their March. The King of Pruffia will be here on the 4th of next Month, he stays but four Days, from hence he goes to Glogaw, where he flays two Days, and from thence streight to Berlin.
