Vienna, July 4, N. S.

THEY write from Znaim in Moravia, that a Body of 400 Troopers, lately recover'd from Sickness, and of 1300 Foot, together with the Artillery, the former under the Command of Count Abruzini, a Captain in the Regiment of Wirtemberg, and the latter of Capt. Schimoda, of the Regiment of Vettes, were march'd by the Roads of Teschan and Retz, to join the Royal Army in Bohemia.

Naples, June 12. They continue to deal very severely here with all those who hold Discourses concerning the present War; and several People have been imprison'd for that Offence.

Florence, June 16. The British Minister here has obtain'd a Permission from the Regency, for having the Ships of War belonging to that Crown, supply'd with such Provisions, as they may have Occasion for, Duty free. By Letters from Nice we understand that they are making all possible Preparations in that Neighbourhood for opposing the Passage of the Spanish Troops from Provence, and are greatly assist'd therein by the English Vice-Admiral Matthews, who continued to lye with a Part of his Fleet at Villa Franca.

Whitehall, July 13.

The King has been pleas'd to grant unto the Right Honourable John Lord Gower, the Office of Keeper of his Majesty's Privy Seal, in the Room of the Right Honourable John Lord Hervey, who has resign'd.

The King has been pleas'd to grant the Dignity of a Baron, Viscount, and Earl of the Kingdom of Great Britain, unto the Right Honourable William Pulteney, Esq, by the Name, Stile and Title of Baron of Hedon, in the County of York, Viscount Pulteney, of Wrington, in the County of Somersfet, and Earl of Bath, in the said County of Somersfet.

The King has been pleas'd to appoint the Right Honourable Allen Lord Bathurst to be Captain of his Majesty's Band of Pensioners, in the Room of his Grace Charles Duke of Bolton.

His Majesty has been pleas'd to appoint the Honourable William Finch, Esq; to be Vice-Chamberlain of his Majesty's Household, in the room of the Right Hon. the Lord Sydney Beauclerk,

His Majesty has been likewise pleas'd to appoint the Honourable Edward Finch, Esq; to be one of the Grooms of the Bedchamber to his Majesty.

The King has been pleas'd to constitute and appoint Lieutenant Colonel Armand de la Bastide, to be Governor of Carisbrook Castle and the Fortifications thereunto belonging, in the Isle of Wight, in the Room of Adam Williamson, Esq; preferred.

All Persons owing or engaged for Arrears of Rent for Wine Licences, or whose Licences are expired, are hereby required to take Notice, That if they do not pay their said Arrears, and renew their said Licences with all Speed, they will be forthwith prosecuted for the same. And whereas his Majesty's Commissioners for granting Wine Licences, have received certain Information of divers Persons presuming to retail Wines without Licence, and to whom Letters have been sent advertising them of the Penalties incurred thereby; these are also to give Notice, that unless such Persons do speedily apply themselves to the said Commissioners, the Laws in such Cases made and provided will be forthwith put in Execution.

General Post Office, London, July 3, 1742.
Whereas divers Persons, thro' Ignorance or Carelessness, frequently put Letters into the General Post Offices, and the Receiving Houses both in Town and Country, directed on board of Ships, and to Foreign Parts, without paying at the same Time the Postage, as ought to be done; And whereas Letters and Packets are often put into the said Offices with Money and Rings inclosed, and in Fraud of his Majesty's Revenue, divers Persons presume to send Letters with false and counterfeit Franks; This is to acquaint the Publick, that no Letters under any of the Circumstances aforesaid have any Right by Law to be forwarded.

Note, That Letters going out of Great Britain (except to France, Holland, and Flanders) have by the ancient Usage of this Office paid the Foreign Postage, and are required by the Act of Parliament so to do, at the Office in Great Britain where the same are first put in.

Note also, That if such Letters to Foreign Parts are put into any of the Country Offices, the Inland Postage of such Letters to London must also be paid on putting the same into such Office.
