from the Camp before Prague of the 17th of August it appears, that the French lost, by the Cannon of the Auftrians, the Colonel of their Huffars named Berezini, with many more Officers of Diffinction; and that the Auftrians had began to batter in Breach one of the Bastions of the Town, fo that they hop'd to be foon ready to make an Affault upon it, and to oblige the French to furrender.

Berlin, Aug. 19, N.S. His Prussian Majesty sets out To-morrow for Aix la Chapelle, by the way of Magdeburg, Wefel, Cleves, and Gueldre; he propofes to drink the Waters eight Days for an Indisposition in his Stomach, but his Majesty is to be back at Magdeburg by the 10th of next Month, to give the Investiture of fome Lands to the Prince of Marsfeldt, from thence to return to Berlin for a few Days, after which he fets out for Silefia.
