Gibraltar, June 29.

THE Plague is more violent than ever in Barbary; about 70 a Day die in Tetuan; and we have Advice from the General of the Spanish Camp, that the Sickneſs is got into Ceuta, and that they have ſent a Phyſician and a Surgeon from Cadiz to enquire into the Nature of the Diſtemper, which it is ſuppoſed they will find to be the ſame that is in other Parts of Barbary. They have ordered Guards along the Spaniſh Coaſt, and make all Veſſels from that Country perform Quarantine. The ſtricteſt Care is taken here to preſerve this Place from the Contagion; and no Ship from that Country is admitted to perform Quarantine. The Garriſon here is in good Health, and have Plenty of Proviſions of all Kinds, except Beef, which we uſed to have from Barbary. We have now a Thouſand Sheep upon the Hill.

Petersbourg, Aug. 6. Laſt Night her Imperial Maſteſty went to reſide in a new Palace in the Summer Gardens, which is a very fine Building, and richly furniſhed with Chineſe Tapeſtry. This Day being the Anniverſary of the Inſtitution of the firſt Regiment of Guards called Preberoſinski, the Empreſs, and his Imperial Highneſs the Great Duke, dined in publick with all the Officers of that Regiment.

Stockholm, Auguſt 19, O. S. Moſt of the Troops here and in the Neighbourhood are on their March towards Scania. The Regiment of Foot Guards will alſo move in a Day or two. It is ſaid that the King of Sweden intends to viſit his German Dominions this Year, and that his Maſteſty deſired Yeſterday the four Orators of the Diet, to acquaint their reſpective Orders therewith.

Naples, Auguſt 13, N. S. The Sickneſs at Meſſina continues to abate, many that have been ill of the Plague recover, and, for many Days together no one has died; but at Reggio in Calabria, and the Places adjacent, many People have died of late, particularly in the Suburbs of Meſſina the Plague rages very much, which occaſions an extreme Apprehenſion all over this Kingdom.

Rome, Auguſt 17. Some few Days ago the Commanders and Knights of the two Malteſe Row Boats, that, in lieu of the Pope's Gallies, have cruized along the Eccleſiaſtical Coaſt, came here from Civita Vecchia, to take their Leave of the Pope, on their Return to Malta. The Pope preſented to each of them a Set of Beades of Lapis Lazrule; and ſome with Gold and others with Silver Medals, according to their Rank. Laſt Week two more Gates of this City, viz. that of St. Sebaſtian and St. Pancrazio, were

ordered to be ſhut up, the better to examine all Paſſengers that arrive in this City.

Florence, Aug. 20. On the 14th Inſtant a Battalion of the Italian Regiment of Foot-Guards was ordered to the Fortreſs of St. Martino on the Bologna Road, and two Battalions of the Lorrain Regiment of Foot-Guards, in Garriſon here, have received Orders to be in Readineſs to march. On the 15th two French Officers, Priſoners of War, releaſed on their Parole, who lately arrived here from Germany, were arreſted at their Lodgings for diſorderly Behaviour. Deſerters out of the Spaniſh Army in the Romagna, daily arrive here.

Copenhagen, September 3. The Military Preparations go on here; but, by the Steps that are taken, it is manifeſt that the Campaign cannot open before the Month of October.

Hague, September 10. By our freſheſt Advices from the Side of the Rhine, the firſt Division of the Dutch Troops were to have reached Worms as Yeſterday. The Admiralty of the Meuſe has received no farther Account of the Veſſel lately ſeen and taken for a Spaniſh Privateer upon this Coaſt.

Admiralty Office, September 1.

The Lords Commiſſioners of the Admiralty have received an Account, that Captain Corniſh, of his Maſteſty's Ship the Guernſey, cruizing off of Malaga, met with a Spaniſh Privateer to the Eaſtward of Cape de Gat, of 22 Carriage Guns, 30 Swivels, and 160 Men, which he chaſed and run aſhore under a ſmall Fort, which he battered, ſunk the Ship, and took the Small Arms and every Thing out of her: She was one of the largeſt Privateers belonging to Malaga. Captain Corniſh has ſince deſtroyed a Barcolongo Privateer of 10 Guns, belonging to the ſame Place.
