

*From the Camp at the Chartreux near Mentz,
O^r. 18, N. S.*

The Army halted two Days at Worms, and on Wednesday the 16th marched again, and arrived here the next Day. The Bridge by which we are to pass the Rhine, will be finished To-morrow, and on the 20th we shall pass that River, and after staying one Day in our former Camp on the other Side, it is expected that we shall march for our Winter-Quarters in Flanders. The King passed the Rhine at Oppenheim the 16th, there being not the least Appearance of the French following us, according to certain Accounts brought by our Hussars, and designed lying that Night either at Giefen or Marburg, and to proceed on his Journey the 17th towards Hanover, where his Majesty proposed to arrive this Day. His Royal Highness the Duke left us Yesterday, and will be this Evening at Cassel. Lord Carteret set out for Hanover the same Day with his Majesty, having crossed the Rhine at Gernsheim, and was to lye that Night at Darmstadt.

Paris, October 19, N. S. Letters from M. de Noailles and M. de Coigny's Armies say, that the Allied Army, and that under Prince Charles, are withdrawing into Winter Quarters, and that the French are preparing to do the same. M. de la Mina is returned again into France, having either been beat back from about Fort Dauphiné, as some Advices mention, or finding that it will be impracticable now the Season is so far advanced, to penetrate with his Forces into Italy. M. de Solar, the Sardinian Ambassador, set out from Paris last Wednesday, and has taken all his Family with him; so that the Correspondence of this Court, and that of Turin, is supposed to be entirely broken off.

Hague, October 22, N. S. We hear from Hanover, that his Britannick Majesty arrived there from the Army upon the Rhine, on Friday last in the Afternoon, in perfect Health.
