Stockholm, October 18. O. S.

ON Wednesday the 12th Instant, the Prince Royal of Sweden arrived at Carlsberg, about two English Miles from hence, where he rested himself two Nights. On Friday Morning between Eleven and Twelve, his Royal Highness made his publick Entry into this Town: The Procession began at Carlsberg, in the following Order. First, three Troops of the Burghers of Stockholm, on Horseback; then came M. Lowen, the Deputy Marshal, who was followed by the Grand Marshal, Senator Akerhielm, the other Officers of the Court, and the Senators, who went to bring His Royal Highness over. These were in their own Coaches: After them came the Prince in one of the King's Coaches, preceded by six Pages on Horseback, and having twelve Lackeys on Foot around it: A Troop of Horse-Guards followed, and after them twelve other Coaches of the King's, in which were the Officers and Gentlemen belonging to his Royal Highness's Retinue. When his Royal Highness came near the Palace, he was saluted by the Regiment of Foot-Guards, who had lined the Avenues leading to the Court, as the Trabants had done all the Apartments in the Castle, to the Chamber of Audience, where the King, being under a Canopy of State, and surrounded by most of the Senators, received his Royal Highness. As soon as the Prince came into his Swedish Majesty's Presence, a Signal being made, the Cannons began to fire from the several Platforms which had been erected on this Occasion, and continued to do so, by Intervals, as likewise Volleys of Small Arms from the Regiment of Foot-Guards, till Evening, when the whole Town was illuminated, several Fire-works play'd off, and all other possible Demonstrations of Joy given. Yesterday his Royal Highness the Prince took the Oaths to the King, in the Presence of the Senate, and the Deputies of the four Orders of the States. On Thursday last General Keith arriv'd here, and the next Day was presented to his Swedish Majesty. Two Days hence the said General proposes to go and see the Russian Troops under his Command, which are arriv'd on the Coast, distributed into their Winter Quarters.
