3000 Huslars and Sclavonians, was advanced from the Cattolica to a little River called Conca, he and the Duke of Modena, at the Head of the whole Army fet out from Fano and Pefaro in the Night, and marched in three Columns in order to surprize them; but, by extreme heavy Rains and stormy Weather, not being able to advance above Four Miles in Six Hours, they were obliged to return back, extremely fatigued, on which Account the Spanish General ordered double Pay to his Soldiers. As foon as Prince Lobcowuż had Notice of the above Defign, he ordered his Troops from Forli and Cesena, with the Aftillery, to join the Army at Rimini and the Cattolica. On the 3d Instant a small Skirmish happened between the Austrian Hussars and the Spanish Michelets, near Pesaro, in which many ipf the latter were killed. M. de Gages has caused a particular Account of his Retreat to be distributed in several Parts, in which he lays regreat Blame on M. Mac Donnel, a Lieutenant General, for not having obeyed the Orders he bad given him, and to which M. de Gages attributes the Diforder, and the great Desertion that enfued.
