Prisoners of War, Serjeants and Soldiers, in all Five Hundred and Twenty.

The Letters from Turin, which brought the Account above inserted, add, that the Piemontese Troops, after so sharp an Engagement, by which they had been so considerably weakened, finding themselves incapable to maintain the Intrenchments any longer, and there being no Possibility of their receiving any Reinforcement from Piemont, as the Communication was cut off, it was resolv'd on the 22d to aban-

don those Works, and to embark what was left of the 14 Battalions on board the Transports, and convey them to Oniglia; this was accordingly executed immediately; but the Easterly Winds continuing to blow pretty fresh, there was no News of their being landed on the 25th in the Morning, when a Courier was dispatched from thence.
