

quit his place very suddenly. The seventh instant the Sieur Pas, late Governor of *Naxden*, received his Sentence, which was, that he should be incapable ever hereafter to bear any Command in his Majesty's service, and that he should be confined to a perpetual prison.

*Amsterdam Nov. 13.* We have had a report here, that the French being about to quit *Stracht*, have resolved to plunder and burn that City before they leave it, but this we cannot believe, but at most that it is only a report to induce the Inhabitants to be the readier to raise the Contribution demanded of them. We hear that the late Treaty betwixt this State and Spain is now ratified by the Crown. Our last Letters from the *Rhin* tell us, that *Bon* holds out very well, notwithstanding they are besieged by an Army of above 40000 Men, according to our calculation; the *Marschal d'Hamieres* lies still about *Cologne*, expecting the coming up of the Duke of *Luxemburg*, with the Troops he has drawn out of the conquered places in *Hire*, &c.

*Hague, Nov. 13.* The 11 instant Count *Waldeck* parted hence for *Naxden*, and we are told, that Count *Horne* lyes with some Troops not far from *B*, to endeavor to intercept the French Garrisons; that they draw out of that place and *Grevecar*. The Heer *van Beurmg* is returned hither, from *Brussels*, and now a Placat will in few days be published, for the forbidding the Importation of French Brandy Wines, and all French Manufactures, as we hear, has been already done in *Flanders*, by order of the Count de *Magnerey*. Here is a discourse of bringing together another body of 10000 Men, to be commanded by Count *Waldeck*, and that they are to join with 6000 Spaniards, the place of Rendezvous to be near *Gorcum*, and it is said, the Troops already begin to March that way. Our last Letters from the Prince of *Oranges* Camp before *Bon*, dated the 11 instant, tell us, That the night before the Dutch Troops had attacked a Half Moon of the Enemies, and that after a fierce Fight, they had taken it, with the loss of a great many Men on both sides, so that we hope the place will not be able to hold out many days more; That the *Rhingrave* Governour is wounded some days before; and that the Count *Coaringsmark* had been killed by a Cannon Bullet, as he was coming out of the Trenches. Yesterday in the Evening Colonel *Grisp* was beheaded privately in prison, according to the Sentence of the Council of War, for several disorders committed by him.
