

Of the Hanoverian Infantry there were killed, 3 Lieutenant Colonels, 3 Captains, 2 Lieutenants, 3 Enfigns, 1 Staff-Officer, 19 Serjeants and 401 private Men. 1 Colonel, 1 Lieutenant Colonel, 2 Majors, 11 Captains, 11 Lieutenants, 10 Enfigns, 2 Staff-Officers, 46 Serjeants, and 866 private Men wounded. 1 Serjeant and 49 private Men miffing.

Of Cavalry, 1 Colonel, 1 Captain, 1 Lieutenant, 1 Cornet, 7 Corporals, 67 private Men, and 268 Horses, killed. 3 Lieutenant Colonels, 3 Captains, 11 Lieutenants, 11 Cornets and Quarter-Masters, 8 Non-Commission Officers, 193 private Men, and 194 Horses, wounded, and 3 private Men and 15 Horses missing.
