Florence, June 15, N.S.

HE Troops at Viterbo have been daily encreased, and a large Body of 2000 Foot is expected from that Part of Ascoli near the Tronto: In the Note the Spanish Consul has given to this Regency, he calls them 5000 Foot, and 800 Horse, but it is assured they amount to near 8000 Foot, and 1500 Horse. They are to be commanded by General Landini, Governor of Pescara. On the 9th Instant Prince Lobcowitz received an Order from the King of Sardinia to march immediately into the Pavisan, which he began to do the next Day, two Bridges having been prepared over the Po for that Purpose. In the last Week his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Lowestoff, Captain Bowdler, sent into Leghorne two Vessels with Genoese Colours laden with Corn from the Coast of Naples, and on the 12th instant, brought with him into that Port three more, two with Genoese, and one with Neapolitan Colours. On the 11th Instant, His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Rochester, brought into the Port of Leghorne, Five Vessels, and after a Stay of some Hours only, put to Sea again, and the next Morning returned with Thirteen more, great and small. On his Return to the Road his Boats attacked two large Feluccas, which had on board Regimentals from Orbitello, but they got fafe into Port.

Captain Brett, in his Majesty's Ship the Lion, being on his Way from Portsmouth to Plymouth, on the 29th of June, about Ten in the Morning, about seven Leagues to the Southward of the Isle of Wight, saw a small French Frigate directly to Windward of him, attacking a Merchant Ship bound up the Channel, to which he immediately gave Chace, came up with and took her, and has sent her into Portsmouth; she had 115 Men, mounted ten Carriage and seven Swivel Guns, and is the same which lately took the Mediator Sloop.
