Constantinople, July 11, N.S.

LL the News we have from Persia is in general, that the Shaugh is retired again of his own Accord from the Turkish Frontiers, which seems to

give great Satisfaction here.

Florence, August 10, N.S. The great Road from Rome to Lorretto, and from thence to Boulogna, is repairing, the Pope intending to pass that Way next Year, and to stay at this last Place the whole Summer, in order to make several new Saints, and to dispose of the Cardinals Hats that are vacant.

Venice, August 13, N.S. We have Advice here, that Serravalle surrender'd the 3d Instant; and the Garrison, consisting of only 150 In valids, were made Prisoners of War. They were so old and so maimed, that Carts were allow'd them to Alexandria. The Trenches were open'd before Tortona on the 8th, and we hear that the Duke of Modena and Marshall Maillebois having been to reconnoitre the Ground, and coming too near the Works, were in Danger from the Cannon which fired upon them. Marshal Maillebois had his Horse killed. and received some Hurt in his Fall. A Criminal at Rome having taken Refuge in the Venetian Ambassador's List, the Sbirri attempted to seize him, in which they were opposed by the Venetian Ambassador's Servants, and a Fray ensued in which the Ambassador's Porter was wounded. To resent this Insult the next Day, some Persons in the Ambassador's Livery killed the Barigello, and wounded some of the Sbirri, The Republick is also engaged in another Contest with the Pope about their Confines. Some of the Pope's Troops in the Ferrarele have late. ly surprised a small Fort at Porto Goro, upon Pretence of its being built upon the Ecclefiastical State. The Venetians erected this a few Years ago upon a Point of this Island, which commands one of the Mouths of the Po, to prevent Contraband, and for the stricter Observation of Quarantine, during the Time of the Plague in the Kingdom of Naples. In order to retake it, they have sent this Week from Venice two Galliots, to cut off the Communication by Sea, and order'd 500 Men from Rovigo, to attack it by Land.

Birth of Prince Christian, and one given to each of the Foreign Ministers here. Lieutenant Colonel Plesse, youngest Son to the Privy-Counsellor, and late Minister of that Name, has received a Chamberlain's Key. A Frigate of 40 Guns is now fitting out to sail for the Island of St. Thomas in America. A Russian Frigate, sent out in Quest of Dagenaer, arrived here Yesterday. She did not meet with him in her Cruize; and we have now a current Report, that his Men (who were all either decoy'd or forced) have deserted him, and that having run the Ship a-ground on the Coast near Dantzick, he had left her, and was sled into a Polish Convent.

Dresden, August 20, N. S. It was expected here that the Prussians would have invaded this Country To-day the 20th; but their real Design is not yet discovered. It is said, that in Case we are attacked, the Duke of Weissensels will march with a Detachment of about 15000 Austrians and Saxons against the Prussians. A Resignment or two of Uhlans are already detached. His Highness returned to the Army upon the 17th, in a tolerable State of Health. The Saxons have 800 Men at Wittenburg; which Place, though it be not in a good State of Defence, cannot yet be taken without Cannot.

Berlin, August 21, N.S. Prince Thieri of Dessau set out early Yesterday Morning for Magdebourg, from whence it is concluded here, that the Prussian Infantry would march Yesterday into the Camp marked out between Halle and Lobechin. An Hospital is building at Halle, and a Magazine at Halbertstatt. Besides the strong Garrison which is at Crossen, it is said a Camp will be formed between that Town and Franckfort, in order to secure the Communication with Silesia. It is also given out, that his Prussian Majesty intends to draw his whole Army out of Bohemia, in order to form a Line in Silesia along the Upper and Lower Lusatia. Great Preparations are making for the Defence of this Capital. Hellerman's Battalion will encamp in the Garden behind the Palace, and Bredow's two Battalions will do the same in two different: Places in the Town. The Battalion of Guards, which remain'd at Potsdam, is expected here, as also five Squadrons of Hustars. The Butchers and Bakers and other Tradesmen are to be form'd into a Regiment of Cayalry, and have received Orders to provide themselves

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
