We hope we shall never forget the late happy Revolution, brought about by King William, of glorious Memory, under the Conduct of Divine Providence, or forbear to contemplate it as the Fountain of all the facred and valuable Privileges which these Nations enjoyed under your Royal Father; and which we, in a particular Manner enjoy under your Majesty's auspicious Reign; the Confideration of which shall ever cement our Hearts, by an unshaken Loyalty to your Majesty's Person and Government, and to the Protestant Succession, as established by Law in your illustrious House.
