Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church, and Archdeacon and Clergy of the Diocese of Gloucester, has been presented to his Majesty by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of that Diocese, being introduced by the Right Hon. the Earl Waldegrave, one of the Lords of his Majesty's Bed-chamber in Waiting: Which Address his Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Bishop, Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church, and Archedeacon and Clergy of the Diocese of Gloucester.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Subjects, the Bishop, Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church, and Archdeacon and Clergy of the Diocese of Gloucester, most humbly beg Leave to take this Opportunity, the first that we have had since the breaking out of the unnatural Rebellion in Scotland, to express jointly to your Majesty our utmost Abhorrence and Detestation of this wicked Attempt, which, at the Incitement of our Enemies Abroad, hath been made at Home in Favour of a popish and adjur'd Pretender.

We have always been mindful of the solemn and just Engagements we are under to God, and to your Majesty, by the Oaths we have taken: And have Hearts sull of Gratitude for the very great Blessings, Religious and Civil, enjoy'd by us under your Majesty's just and auspicious Government; on which, as we are certain that we may, with the Blessing of God, depend for their being at all Times continued to us; so we are not less assured, that if this Rebellion should meet with Success, which God avert, it would

foon establish both Popery and Arbitrary Power amongst us. And these, joined together, would throw us into Misery beyond Expression, without any Prospect of Deliverance from it.

Our earnest Endeavour therefore hath been. and at all Times shall be, as Members of a free Government, and Ministers of a Protestant Church, to oppose, as far as in us lies, in our several Stations, both this and all other Attempts which may be made by this Pretender, or any other Enemies to your Majesty, our Religion and our Country. Our Labours, our Fortunes, and our Lives, if it shall please God to call us to this Trial, shall be devoted to this Purpose. And we will carefully improve all Occasions, which our Functions may afford us, both in publick and in private, to raise in our Fellow Subjects a well-grounded Zeal for our holy Religion. a hearty Concern for the Welfare of our Country, with a warm and dutiful Loyalty to your Majesty. And as the most effectual and only fure Means of making your People firmly loyal and faithful to your Majesty, we shall labour in the first Place to make them truly sensible of their Duty to God; and we shall strive to the utmost of our Power to stem that Torrent of Vice and Irreligion which has broken in upon us, and has a natural Tendency to dissolve the Bands of Society, and destroy all Government and Authority whatsoever.

At the same Time that we are inculcating these Principles of Loyalty towards your Majesty, whom God grant long to reign over us, we shall also impress upon the Minds of the People under our Care, a constantly affectionate Attachment to your Royal House; on the happy Increase of which, by the safe Delivery of her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales and the Birth of a Prince, we most humbly beg Leave to congratulate your Majesty. And as we cannot but defire to transmit the Blessings ourselves enjoy to our latest Posterity, so we cannot, for the same Reason, but servently wish and pray, that, in order thereto, the Sceptre of

these Kingdoms may for ever be continued in your illustrious House; that your Royal Descendants may be, under God, the blessed Means of securing to all suture Ages, that happy Constitution in Church and State, which your Maz Gesty new preserves sinviolate to us.

His Grace the Duke of Newcastle having received by the Penny Post a Letter dated the 6th Instant, and signed C. D.; if the Person who wrote the said Letter will make himself known to his Grace, he may depend upon the strictest Secrecy, and upon all fitting Encouragement.

Edinburgh, Jan. 2. The Number of the Rebels arrived at Glasgow, by a Medium of several Computations, is about 3600 Foot, and near 500 Horse, including 50 or 60 employed in carrying their Sick. Their Horses are poor and jaded, and 6 or 700 of their Foot have no Arms or Ability to use them. Some hundreds of their Friends have passed the Forth in their Way to Glasgow; and on Saturday last the Person called Duke of Perth, with a Party of about 150, went from Glasgow, and it-is reported he is got home. Small Parties are continually passing that Way, whether deserting or marching to Perth is not known. However it is certain that they have lost several by Desertion and Death since they arrived at Glasgow, where they have also inlisted about 50 or 60, who took on with them for Want of Bread. Their Demands upon Glasgow for Broad cloth, Tartan, Linnen, Bonnets, and Shoes, amount to near 10,000 l. Sterling in Value; besides which, they fay they must have a Sum of Money. They have asses'd Provost Buchannan in 500 l. for promoting the new Levies on the Behalf of the Government, and have been very outragious against all those who appeared zealous and active in railing them, by plundering and burning their Houses, destroying their Goods and Furniture, and (where they could not carry off their Provisions) by spoiling them in a most unheard-of Manner, which, so far from having the Effect they proposed, has greatly increased the Spirit against them. They give out that they are to attack Stirling, and on Monday Noon the Cannon from Perth was moved towards that Place, amongst which are two Pieces of 8 Pounders, two of 12, two of 16, all Brass, besides Iron Cannon, and a large Quantity of Powder and Ball; the Rebels from Perth marched therewith. The Prisoners, who were at Perth are sent to Glames. Here are Advices here, that the Rebels had got some of their Military Stores, particularly Iron Cannon and Ball, from Montrose by Sea to Perth, and that they had fitted out the Hazard Sloop, and a Privateer at Montrose, which were ready to put to Sea, and that they were also fitting out; an armed Sloop at Perth, last Place they have fortify'd Oliver's Mount, and have from 100 to 200 Country People daily employed in fortifying the whole Town. As soon as we heard that the first Division of the Troops sent to this Place from Marshal Wade's Army had passed Newcastle, we began to repair the Fortifications of this City, and gave Notice to the People in the Country, upon whom we could depend, to be in Readiness to come hither for the Defence of the City. The Friends to

the

the Rebels in these Parts sent Express after Express to them to Glasgow, to hasten their march hither, and on Monday Night we had Intelligence that they had called in their Cloathing half made, and packed it up, which we took for a Signal of their March. Thereupon the Militia was called into the City, and more came than we could quarter. Horses were ordered out to meet the first Division of Troops, and Relays were ready for them upon the Road, which the Country People contributed with great Chearfulness; and this Morning Two Regiments of the first Division arrived here mounted on the Horses before-mentioned from Dunbar, and were received with Huzzas, Illuminations, &c. The Soldiers are all hearty. They were entertained at Dunbar, and Half-way Place at Aberlady, at the Expence of the County of East Lothian, and this Night will be so at the Expence of the City; so that now we think ourselves quite safe from the Rebels. The Glasgow Regiment is here, and makes a very fine Appearance. It consists of upwards of 500, all young able-bodied Men, who perform their Excercise extremely well, and do Duty with the Regular Troops, besides 160 Volunteers from Paisly. They thew'd a great Spirit in marching hither, when it appeared impracticable to defend Glasgow. There certainly has been a Skirmish between the Rebels near Aberdeen, and a Part of Lord Loudoun's Men commanded by the Lairds of N acleod and Calcairn; it is faid to have ended to the Disadvantage of the latter, who were in-

ferior in Numbers. There are however as yet no Accounts of that Affair but what the Rebels give; the most sanguine of whom say, it was a total Route; others, that about 20 on each Side were killed, and about 60 of our Men taken Prisoners. The Argylshire Men are now ready to co-operate with our Troops.

Admiral Byng, who is now in Leith Road, is preparing to go out again to Sea; the Milford and Bridgwater, who were left cruizing off Montrole; will, it is hoped, be able to prevent the Rebels from receiving any Supply-at Perth, and sending out any Ships to Sea; and in two or three Days Admiral Byng will have another 40 Gun Ship, and two of 20, cruizing upon that Coast; and this Morning the Shark will go out to cruize off Red Hed, Arbroth, and the River Tay.

Newcastle, Jan. 4. The first Division of the ten Battalions, which marched from hence for Edinburgh, arrived there the 1st Instant. The second, it is supposed, will be there either this Day or To-morrow. The third by the 9th, and Lord Cobham's Regiment of Dragoons will arrive there the Day after. The Regiments of Scotch Fuzileers and Sempil will be here the 6th; which, after resting one Day, will proceed to Edinburgh to join General Hawley's Body, which will then consist of three Regiments of Dragoons and 14 Battalions, besides the Country Forces. A great Number of the Rebels are said to have deserted, and returned to their Habitations.
