Petersbourg, February 21.

HIS Morning early died, in an advanced Age, Prince Dolgorouky, the eldest Feldt Marshal of this Empire. Copenbagen, March 5, N. S. By Letters from Gottenbourg of the 26th past, there is Advice, that the Frederick, which was to fail with the Swedish Officers, was then frozen up there.

Berlin, March 12. The King of Prussia continues still at Potzdam, and is not now expected here before the 26th Instant. Major General Walrave, Chief of the Corps of Engineers, repaired some Days ago from Magdebourg to Potzdam. Upon several Complaints against the Margrave of Schwedt, by his own Subjects, his Prussian Majesty had directed a Commission to examine their Grievances and to redress them; but his Highness not being pleased with what has been sentenced by the said Commissioners in Favour of the Subjects, and going on with regard to them as formerly, 300 Dragoons have been fent to Schwedt, to remain there till his Highness fubmits to the Judgment; and the King of Prusfia's Attorney General is gone likewise to examine into the Grievances of the Peasants.

Liege, March 15. The French in Alface are augmenting the Fortifications of Landau, and repairing the Lines of Germersheim and Lauterbourg. We have Advice from Francfort, that Esterhasi's Regiment of Hustars, sollowed by Wurmbrand's, passed by that City upon the 8th

and 9th of this Month.

Bruffels, March 17, N.S. We have Advice from Mons, that the French Troops are cantoned in such a Manner about that City, that nothing can go into it without their Leave. We hear from Malines, that the Prince of Waldeck continues in his old Polition, being Master of the Dyle and the Rupple. The Hotel d'Egmont, in this Town, is fitting up for the Reception of the French King. M. Lowendahl is making new Fortifications here, the chief of which are between the Gates of Scharbeek and Louvain, and those of Namur and Halle.

Willemstadt, March 15, N.S. The British Dragoons returned hither the 8th Instant. The

9th they began to disembark: It blew so hard ' the 11th, that there was no Possibility of bringing a Ship to the Head; it froze very hard the 12th and the 13th; there was more Ice in the River than has been seen this Winter; the Transports were much damaged by it, and with great Difficulty ran their Ships on Shore. It thawed very fast Yesterday, and does the same to Day, so to Morrow we hope to disembark again. The Council of State has appointed one M. Teddinga, Lieutenant Quarter-master General to their High Mightinesses, to succeed Colonel. Stuart as Conductor to the British Troops thro' their Territories.

Willemstadt, March 18. The British Dragoons are disembarked from all the Transports except two, so that the whole will be finished early to Morrow Morning, if the Weather will permit. As these Forces have come on Shore, they have advanced to their old Cantonments in the States Territories, and the whole Corps will march about Monday or Tuelday next towards Antwerp.

Hague, March 18. The Prince of Waldeck still maintains his Post behind the Dyle without Molestation, and receives daily Reinforcements to his Army. Mons and Charleroy are so environed by the French, that the Dutch Soldiers returned from Furlo, and the Recruits, cannot, as is said, join their Regiments in those Garrifons.

Whitehall, March 10.

This Day an Express arrived from his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland, with the fol-

lowing Intelligence.

Aberdeen, March 5. The whole Army arrived at this Place by the End of last Week; and we shall have within these four or five Days a Recruit of 500 recovered Men from Edinburgh and England, befides the Regiment of Bligh, which is coming up by Sea; and as the Hellians are moving forwards towards Perth, the Scotch Fusileers are also to come up this Way from that Place, as soon as the first Division of the Hessians draws near it; and the Duke of Kingston's Regiment of Horse is within a March of us. The Day after his Royal Highness came hither,
