

and Persons as they shall find playing or present in such Gaming Houses or Places; and also the Keepers of such Houses and Places, and of disorderly or lewd Houses, and carry all of them the next Day before one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, in order to be dealt with according to Law.

And it is also ordered, That all Constables, Beadles and Peace-Officers shall apprehend all Beggars lying in the Streets, or wandering and begging there, either by Day or Night; all Persons driving or carrying Orange Barrows, and enticing Servants and Children to play for them; all persons prophanely Cursing and Swearing, and carry them before one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the Purposes aforesaid.

And it is hereby resolved, that His Majesty's Justices of the Peace do hold a special Sessions in each respective Parish wherein they are resident, twice in every Week, or as Occasion shall require, in order to bring to Justice such Offenders, whose Offences shall require more than one Justice of the Peace for that Purpose.

Hague, December 15, N. S. A Deputation from the States of Overysseel arrived here two Days ago with the Resolution of that Province, by which the Dignity of Stadtholder is made hereditary in the Prince of Orange's Family, both in the Male and Female Line, without any Restrictions whatsoever. The solemn Deputation from Zealand upon the same Occasion has been expected here these three Days; but as the Yacht that brings the Deputies has not been heard of since last Tuesday, it is greatly feared some Accident has happened to her in the violent Storm of Wind we had here last Tuesday Night, of which the like is hardly remembered in this Country. As Vice-Admiral Schryver sailed that very Morning for the Texel, in order to go to Sea with the Fleet under his Command, and has not been heard of since; we are in great Apprehensions on his Account, as well as for all the Shipping in Zealand. The Packet Boat of this Day Se'nnight from England, which happened to be at Sea during the Storm, got safe to Helvoetsluys last Night. We were informed last Night by an Express from Nimeguen, that the Day before, the Burghers of that Town having assembled to a very considerable Number, had sent to their Magistrates, who were then met upon Business in the Stadt-House, to know their Resolution in regard to the Stadtholder's Commission and the hereditary Succession. To which the Magistrates having given their Consent, a Deputation from the Burghers of that Town arrived here this Day to acquaint the Prince of Orange with the Resolution of their Regency.

Rotterdam, Dec. 15, N. S. We have yet no Account from Zealand of the Damage that last Tuesday's Storm has done to the Shipping

there and in the Schelde; the Armed Vessels at the Pas have suffered much in their Masts and Rigging. As Admiral Schryver's Squadron is not mentioned in the Texel List amongst the Ships that are either lost or have suffered, there are Hopes that they have received no Damage. All the Ships in Helvoet Road drove. His Britannick Majesty's Ship Margate and the Ferret Sloop, lost each a Mast, and Orders were immediately given from the Admiralty of the Maese, to their Store-keeper at Helvoet, to supply them. A Transport from Williamstadt with Invalids and recovered Men, was on Shore, but the People were all safe.
