Liege, February 13.

THE French are actually cutting down vast Quantities of Timber about Namur to make large and small Planks, Pallisadoes, and Carriages for their Cannon. They work hard in the Arsenal filling of Bombs, preparing their Battering Train, &c. and all the Forges for three Leagues round are employed in casting Bombs and Cannon Balls. The Leave of Absence given to the French Officers is prolong'd till the 1st of April, and as yet not above 7800 Recruits are arrived for the 104 Battalions left in the Low Countries and the Frontier Towns of France. Marshal Lowendahl is daily expected at Namur.

Hague, Feb. 16. The States of Holland have resolved upon a second Lottery, for the Sum of 4,300,000 Florins, to be drawn next June. They have consented this Morning to allow the Council of State the Sums desired by their two Petitions, for the Expences of the Winter Quarters, and for recruiting Charges, and Gratifications to be given to all the Captains of Horse, Dragoons, and Foot in their Service. The Prince of Orange has ordered a Revision of Lieutenant General la Roque's Trial; for which Purpose, his Highness has added six General Officers to the Council of War that was at first appointed for that Affair. The Margrave of Baden Dourlach concluded Yesterday his Capi-

tulation with the States General for a Battalion of 880 Men. Count Fleming left this Place this Morning in order to embark for England.
