Vienna, February 7, N. S.

HIS Imperial Majesty having been graciously pleased to appoint the 3d Instant for the Investiture of the Electorate of Triers, his Excellency Count Schonborn, Privy Counsellor of the Electors of Mentz and Triers, as first Plenipotentiary, and M. de Brée as Second, being appointed for that Ceremony on the Part of the Elector, they repaired on the said 3d Instant at Noon to Court with great Magnificence; where being arrived, they were received in the Antichamber by his Excellency Count Khevenhuller, Grand Chamberlain, and conducted by him into the Hall, where his Imperial Majesty, attended by all the great Officers and Ministers of the Empire, was already seated on the Throne; his Excellency Count Schonborn made a fine Speech to the Emperor, and was answered by his Excellency Count Coloredo, Vice Chancellor of the Empire, in the Name of his Imperial Majesty; whereupon the Ceremony was performed in the usual Manner, and was concluded by a Speech of Thanks made by M. de Brée in the Name of the Elector.

Venice, Feb. 9, N. S. The Beginning of this Week there came into this Port from Bristol a Merchantship, called the Constantine, Captain Read: In his Passage through the Channel of Malta, on the 2d of January O. S. he fell in with six French Merchantmen bound from the Levant to Marseilles, and took three of them, the John Baptist, 58 Men and 12 Guns; the St. Blaize, 33 Men and 10 Guns; and a Polacca: The two large Ships were laden with Silks and Linens, and are valued at Thirty Thousand Pounds. He has left his Prizes at Malta.

Hague, Feb. 20, N. S. The Deputation, which was intended from Zealand

in December last, but was prevented by the great Storm, in which the Deputies were very near losing their Lives, arrived here two Days ago, and presented this Morning to the Prince of Orange the Diploma, by which the Stadtholdership of their Province is made Hereditary both in the Male and Female Line of his Highness's Family. Most of the Officers, who were here, are set out, in Consequence of the Orders they have received to repair to their respective Posts by the 25th Instant, and the rest are preparing to follow them.

Hague, Feb. 23, N. S. The Prince of Orange has issued three Military Regulations, the Chief of which relates to the Number of Aid de Camps that each General Officer is to be allowed, viz. Three for a General, two for a Lieutenant General, and one for a Major General: Their Aid de Camps are, as much as possible, to be chosen out of the Regiments that are not to take the Field; and the Generals are expressly forbid having in their Retinue any Volunteers who are Officers in the Republick's Service. We hear from France, that the Dutch Officers and Private Men, who are Prisoners of War, have been imprisoned to prevent their making their Escape, upon hearing

of the Regulation of the States, by which it is intended to reduce them to Half Pay, till such Time as they are set at Liberty. Prince Frederick of Hesse Cassel arrived here this Morning, and Marshal Bathiani is expected every Hour.
