Hambourg, February 27.

THE Stadtholder of Ducal Holstein arrived here Yesterday from Keill, and proposes to stay some Time with his Mother the Dutcheſs of Holstein. The Sieur Klefeker, appointed particular Agent for this City in Holland, is to set out some Day this Week for the Hague.

Hambourg, March 5. The Dutch Levies go on here with great Success. The Weather continues to be so extremely severe, that all Navigation up this River is hindered by the Frost.

Lisbon, March 4, N. S. By an Express which arrived a few Days ago from Cadiz, Six Spanish Men of War were seen coming into that Bay, where they were to join three Men of War fitted out there, in order to convoy a considerable Number of Merchant Ships to the West Indies. And it is said likewise, that three French Men of War were expected at Cadiz from Toulon. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Diamond, which sailed from hence on the 24th past, in Company with the Russell Man of War, with the Convoy for England, was obliged to return hither a few Days since in a very leaky Condition.

Lisbon, March 10, N. S. Five of the Rio de Janeiro Fleet are come up the River, and the rest are expected as soon as the Wind will permit.

Dresden, March 17, N. S. The March of the Russians continues to be very quick; they are well furnished with every Thing the Country affords, for which they pay in ready Money. It is certain there were some Thoulands of them arrived at Grodno the 2d Instant; and it is not doubted but the whole Army will be at Warsaw by the 25th.

Whitehall, March 19.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Sir John Ligonier, Knt. of the Bath, and General of Horse, the Office and Place of Lieutenant General of his Majesty's Ordnance, in the room of Field Marshal Wade, deceased.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Charles Howard, Esq; Lieutenant General of his Majesty's Forces, to be Colonel of the Third Regiment of Dragoon Guards, in the room of Field Marshal Wade, deceased.

George Beauclerk, Esq; commonly called Lord George Beauclerk, to be Colonel of the Regiment of Foot late under the Command of Lieutenant General Howard.

John Jordan, Esq; to be Colonel of the Regiment of Marines, late under the Command of Lord George Beauclerk.

Henry Whitley to be Lieutenant Colonel to the Regiment of Dragoons commanded by the Right Honourable Lord Viscount Cobham, in the room of the said Colonel Jordan.

Robert Ellison, Esq; to be Lieutenant Governor of the Island of Cape Breton, in the room of Lieutenant Colonel Hobson.

And David Middleton, Surgeon, to be Surgeon General to his Majesty's Forces, in the room of Surgeon Pawlett, deceased.
