THIS Court has been ever since Easter-day at the Royal Villa of Portici, and will not return to this Capital till the 9th of next Month. The Queen advances happily in her Pregnancy, and the Prince Royal, who had been somewhat indisposed, is now perfectly well. The St. Carlo, a Man of War of 50 Guns, is fitted out, and is expected to sail To-morrow on a Cruize, towards the Adriatick Sea, against the Tripoline Rovers, who for two or three Months past, have greatly infested those Coasts, and taken eight or ten Vessels laden with Corn and other Provisions for this City. Two Gallies and three Galliots are ordered to join the said Man of War.

Turin, June 22, N. S. Orders were sent from hence, on the 10th Instant, to Baron Leutrum, to settle with Marshal Belleisle the Cessation of Hostilities between the Piemontese and French Troops. And this Morning a Letter was received from Baron Leutrum, with an Account, that every Thing was settled to the mutual Satisfaction of all Parties; That in the Ponente the Borders of the River Roia were to be the Limits on both Sides; to the French, from Ventimiglia to Sospel, and to the Piemontese, from Dolceacqua to Breille; and that with regard to the Posts in the high Mountains, each Party should continue in those they were possessed of. Marshal Belleisle has also proposed, that for easing the Country and the Troops on both Sides, he would withdraw several Battalions to the other Side the Var, if Baron Leutrum would send back a proportionable Number of his into Piemont, which his Sardinian Majesty has approved. Marshal Belleisle has sent Orders to M. Mirépoix immediately to publish the Armistice on the Frontiers of Dauphiné; and the same will be done this Day by the King of Sardinia's Officers on that Side. The Duke de Richelieu is likewise instructed to agree with the Governor of Savona on proper Limits between that Town and Genoa; and it is not question'd, but the like Measures will be taken with regard to the Body commanded by M. de Nadasti towards the Bochetta, Gavi and Novi. We are inform'd that the Suspension of Arms, between the Imperial and French

Troops, was likewise publish'd in the Levante on the 15th Instant.
