## A P R O C L A M A T I O N.

**W**HEREAS the Lords Justices of Great Britain have signified unto us their Pleasure, that the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now stands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifth Day of July next, be further prorogued to Tuesday the Seventh Day of March next; We do therefore publish and declare, That the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is hereby further prorogued to Tuesday the Seventh Day of March next: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament, are to take Notice accordingly.

*Naples, June 25, N. S.* On the 13th Instant the young Prince of Calabria's Birth-day was celebrated in this City with great Solemnity, the Foreign Ministers, Nobility, and Military Officers appearing in their richest Habits. In the Evening a triple Discharge was made of the Cannon of these Castles, and of the Ship of War St. Charles on this Occasion. On the 21st a Quarrel happened between some Seamen of the Little Mole and those of the Custom-house Guard Sloops; five Hundred of the former rose in a Tumult, and destroyed two of these Sloops, and tore their Colours; at which Proceedings the Government is greatly offended, and has given proper Directions to bring the Ring-leaders to their deserved Punishment.

*Rome, June 29, N. S.* On the 23d Instant arrived in this City from Naples, one of the King of the Two Sicilies Secretaries, on his Journey to Parma, with Directions to make the necessary Dispositions to fit out the Ducal Palace there for the Reception of Don Phillip, who, it is said, proposes to be at Parma in the Month of September next. On the 28th, being the Eve of St. Peter's Festival, the Constable Colonna, as Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of Naples, presented to the Pope, with the usual publick Formalities, in a Cavalcade, the

yearly Tribute of a White Horse for the Kingdom of Naples.

*Florence, July 2, N. S.* Count Lorenzi, the French Minister, has lately receiv'd Directions from his Court, to give the Title, both to the Emperor and Empress, of Imperial Majesty. Since the Publication of the Armistice, the Austrian Troops continue on the Borders of the Genoese State, having drawn a Line from Brugnato to Bischia and Varese, the Head Quarters of Marshal Brown. On the 26th an Armistice was published in Bisagno, in the Neighbourhood of Genoa, between the Spanish and Austrian Troops, and Transports are getting together in Provence to carry the former back to Catalonia. On the 27th an Armistice was likewise published at St. Pier d'Arcana, between the King of Sardinia's and the Spanish Troops.

*Hague, July 12, N. S.* Things are at present quiet in this Province, the Attention of the Publick being taken up about the Finances, which it is hoped may be put upon a better Footing than before. In Friesland the Confusion and Disorders are greater than ever, insomuch that the Deputies to the States from the Quarter of Ostergow had Thoughts of resigning their Commissions; but the Prince of Orange being apprized of their Intention, has sent to them to desire that they would by no Means take this Step, as might be productive of the worst Consequences. M. de Schildt, who arrived here a few Days ago, has presented his Credentials as Minister from the Grand Duke of Russia to the States General.

*Head Quarters at Nisteroy, July 12.* The Troops are getting into their Quarters of Cantonment, several Corps having already moved from the Camp. His Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland goes To-morrow to Eindhoven.

*Head Quarters at Eindhoven, July 16.* His Majesty's British Troops are already all cantoon'd, as his Electoral ones will also be before the End of this Week.

*Hague, July 16, N. S.* General Greveftein is come back from Friesland without having been able to do any Thing towards settling the Disorders in that Province. It is thought that the Prince Stadtholder will soon send a Deputation thither. The States of Holland have been deliberating ever since last Friday on the Ways and Means for making good the Deficiency occasion'd in their Revenue, by the Abolition of the Imposts.
