Hogue, July 19, N.S. **HE** Difficulties which have occurr'd in the Execution of the Plan offer'd 1- for making good the Deficiency occafion'd in the Revenue of this Province, by the Suppression of the Farms, are not yet removed; and the Town of Amsterdam continues to oppose the Method, according to which it is proposed to levy, provisionally, the Quotas of the feveral Towns. It feems their chief Objection to this Plan is, that the Magistrates are to be empowered to diffrain in Default of Payment, and that they themselves will likewise be liable to be distrain'd, in case they don't remit to the publick Treasure, at the End of every Month, the Quotas of their feveral Districts. The Deputies of Dort having inform'd the States of Holland that a Post Office was become vacant in their Town, and the Grand Penfionary having also acquainted them, that there was likewile one vacant at the Hague, they have been defired to give their Orders in Confequence of these two Vacancies; and a Refolution has been taken, by which they empower the Burgher-mafters and Magistrates of those several Towns, where the Post Offices, when vacant, are to revert to the Province, 'to manage those Offices, 'or cause them to be administer'd for the Use of the Province, provisionally, and till such Time as the States, are come to a final Determination in regard to this Affair. The States have taken a Refolution, whereby they appoint the first Day of their Meeting in September next for the Reception of the Lifts which the Deputies of the Towns Swere- formerly Alrected to lag! before then; of all the Employments in the Disposal of their respective Regencies. **فب بن ا**لدند Q JEL 11
