Berlin, July 16, N. S.

**T**HE King of Prussia returned hither from Stettin last Friday Evening, and sets out for Potsdam early on Sunday Morning.

*Dresden, July 17, N. S.* By Letters just come in from Warsaw, there is an Account, that the Archbishop of Gnezna, Primate of all Poland, died the 8th Instant; and that the King of Poland did immediately nominate M. Comorouski, a Canon of Cracow, to succeed him in the said Archbishoprick.

*Hague, July 23, N. S.* On Saturday last the States of Holland assented, with a very small Alteration, to the Scheme for replacing the abolish'd Farms by some new Taxes. By their Resolution the Magistrates of the several Towns are empower'd to raise, in the Manner they shall think proper, amongst the Inhabitants of their District, the Quo as prescrib'd to them, and to restrain in Default of Payment: But in case the Magistrates should fail to remit to the Publick Treasure, at the End of every Month, the Quotas of their respective Districts, they are to produce the Reasons for it, and the Prince of Orange is to judge of their Validity; and in Case his Highness should not, in Equity, think them satisfactory, the Magistrates themselves are then to be restrained, as having been neglectful in the Execution of their Trust. After taking this Resolution the States separated; but are to meet again Tomorrow, when they are to terminate this Affair by Resumption, and to draw up the Placart to enact this new Regulation.
