THE King sets out To-morrow for Gottingen, and proposes to return on Saturday next.

Hague, August 2, N. S. The Deputation from the States General, which is intended to be sent to Friesland, will be appointed in a few Days. In the mean while Lieutenant General Gravestins was sent thither three Days ago with a Commission from the Prince of Orange; and five Regiments of Foot, besides two Regiments of Horse, are now advancing towards that Province, under the Command of Major General Sygers. The Riot that happened lately in North Holland, on Account of the Tythes which the Boors refus'd to pay, is ordered to be strictly inquired into, and is to be treated very seriously. The Prince of Orange, on this Occasion, assisted last Week at the Deliberations of the Court of Justice, when it was resolved to send into North Holland two Judges of that Court, together with the Fiscal, and all his Bailiffs and other Attendants, to take proper Cognizance of this Affair, with Orders to the regular Troops to assist them, if required, in the Execution of their Office. The States General have resolved to settle the Succession to the Dignities of Captain and Admiral General of the Union upon the Prince of Orange's Male and Female Issue; and a solemn Deputation is to be appointed to wait upon his Highness with their Diploma. Baron de Duing, who commanded one of the Bavarian Regiments in this Country, has quitted that Service, to enter into that of the Republick, with the Rank of Major General.
