*Naples, August 20, N. S.*

**I**N the Evening of the 15th Instant, the usual Annual Fair was opened in the Neighbourhood of the Royal Palace, and their Majesties in an open Coach took several Turns about it. The Marquis de Gregorio, the late Agent Victualler General of the French and Spanish Troops in Lombardy, has been appointed by the King, Superintendent General of the Custom House here, with the Appointment of 2000 Ducats per Annum.

*Hanover, Sept. 15, N. S.* His Majesty sets out for the Gohrde on Monday next.

*Hague, Sept. 17, N. S.* The Prince of Orange returned to this Place last Sunday Evening, with Count Bentinck and the Greffier Fagel, who both attended his Highness the whole Time he was at Amsterdam. Before he left that Town, he deposed the nine reigning Echevins, five of which were however immediately restored to their Office, and four new ones appointed instead of the others. His Highness likewise reform'd the Oud-Raad, or Old Council, by striking off of the List forty eight Members, out of near ninety of which that Body consisted. The Independent Council of War was also appointed last Saturday; but as the Prince had proposed in his Proclamation of the 10th, that the Council of War should elect by Majority of Votes, five Colonels, and fill up in the same Manner the other vacant Commissions; or else that a List should be made out of double the Number of Persons required, out of which his Highness should nominate those he should think proper to fill up the Vacancies; the Burghers chose to follow the first of those Methods, and have accordingly elected their five Colonels, and all the other Officers of the Militia. Count Bentinck and M. Van Borselen propose to set out To-morrow for Aix la Challe; but no Day is yet fixed for M. C. Bentinck's Departure for Hanover. The States Ge-

neral have granted to their East India Company a Renewal of its Charter for the Term of 20 Years.

*St. James's, September 10.*

This Morning his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland set out for Harwich, to embark there for Holland.
