

called Shawrouke, and is about 14 Years old, Mirza Ibrahim immediately sent for, and promised to make him King; but his Guardians, who are esteemed the wisest People in the Kingdom, would not trust to his Promises, but got him crown'd at Moshatt; and the Person who had the Care of Audel Shah's immense Treasure, called Seif Odeen Caun, came over to his Party, which has proved of singular Advantage to his Affairs. Mirza Ibrahim has also been crown'd, and seems resolv'd to make one bold Push for the Diadem: At present their Armies cannot meet for the Severity of the Winter, and Scarcity of Provisions, there being a Famine in most Parts of the Kingdom; but it is thought, by the Beginning of April, the Sword will determine this Affair by a most bloody Battle. Shawrouke Shah is still at Moshatt, and Mirza Ibrahim at Tabreeze; and it is thought they will meet near Casbin. Shawrouke was born the same Day and Hour that Nadir Shah took Candahar from the Ophgoons; from which Circumstance he became so far his greatest Favourite, that, after his India Expedition, he ordered 12000 Tomands to be coined in his Name, in Rupees, at Hyraut.

*Constantinople, May 23.* We have received Advice of the Death of Abdulah, Pascha of Bosnia, who was near 90 Years of Age. On the 12th Instant, about Four of the Clock in the Afternoon, we were alarmed with the Rumour of a Rebellion, on which the Vizir went immediately about the Streets, and the Janizar Aga to the Place where Arms are usually sold, but found not the least Emotion. The first Intimation of it came from the Seraglio to the Porte; and as it was imagined to be chiefly owing to the extravagant Price of Bread, an Armenian Baker was beheaded on the 8th, and some Turks strangled, since which its Price is lowered, as is also that of Rice, and some other Necessaries.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of Parliament made in the Fifteenth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for Vacating the Office of King's Professor of Physick in Dublin, upon the Death or Surrender of the present King's Professor, and for Erecting three Professorships of Physick in the said City instead thereof, it is, among other Things, Enacted, That upon the next Vacancy in the said Professorship, by the Death or Surrender of Doctor James Grattan, the Body Politick and Incorporate of the King's Professor of Physick in the City of Dublin, created by the Charter therein mentioned, should be dissolved, cease and be void; And that there should be thenceforth for ever, within the said City, three Professors, to be called by the Names of the King's Professor of Physick in the City of Dublin, the King's Professor of Chirurgery and Midwifery in the City of Dublin, and the King's Professor of Pharmacy and the Materia Medica in the City of Dublin; and that the Provost of Trinity College near Dublin, the Professor of Physick in the same, the President and two eldest Censors of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland, all for the Time being, should be Examinators of the Candidates who should offer themselves for the said three Professorships. AND WHEREAS the said Doctor James Grattan is since dead;

NOW we the Examinators aforesaid, having this Day met at the said Provost's House in Trinity College aforesaid, do hereby, in Pursuance of the said Act, give this publick Notice, That the Examinations, in the several Parts of Physick, of the Candidates who shall offer themselves for the said three Professorships, will be held at Trinity College near the City of Dublin, on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, which will be the Twenty-fifth, Twenty-sixth and Twenty-seventh Days of September next; the said Examinations to begin at One of the Clock in the Afternoon of each of said Days, and to continue for Two Hours each Day. And in order to encourage Candidates to offer themselves for such Professorships, NOTICE is also hereby given, That the said Professors will be intituled to the Use of the Library in the said Act mentioned, and to the clear Rents and Profits of the real Estate of the late Sir Patrick Dun, Knight, M. D. deceased, and to the Produce of the Residue of his personal Estate, to be laid out as the said Act directs; all to be equally divided among such three Professors (and now computed, at a gross Calculation, to be about Ninety Pounds a Year or upwards to every one of the said Professors respectively, and, at the Fall of a Life, will be considerably more) during such Time as they shall respectively behave well, and justly and truly discharge the several Offices and Duties respectively to such Professorships belonging; which Duties of the said Professors are as follows respectively, that is to say, The King's Professor of Physick in the said City, is to read Publick Lectures on the Theory and Practice of Physick; The King's Professor of Chirurgery and Midwifery in the said City, is to read publick Lectures in Chirurgery and Midwifery; And the King's Professor of Pharmacy and the Materia Medica in said City, is to read publick Lectures on ancient and modern Pharmacy and the Materia Medica; All which Lectures are to be in the Latin Tongue, on three several Days in each Week during
