And any Doctor of Physick in any University, who is not a Papist, or Person professing the Popish Religion, or who, by any Law in this Kingdom, is not deemed a Papist, may be a Candidate for any of the said Professorships; and being on Examination found duly qualified, is capable to be elected to any of the said Professorships; such Candidates and Candidate giving in his Name in Writing to the Provost of Trinity College aforesaid, or, in his Absence, to the Vice-Provost thereof for the Time being, Eight Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Examinations aforesaid. And the said Examinators are respectively obliged, before they proceed on such Examination, to take an Oath that they shall, without Favour or Affection, Hatred or Prejudice, to any Person or Candidate, impartially proceed in such their Examination as the said Act directs.
