Constantinople, August 25.

HERE has been some great and considerable Changes; the first was in the Interior of the Seraglio. The Jazigi Effendi, or Secretary to the Kizlar Aga, or Chief of the Black Eunuchs, is made Bash Muhas Zebegi Harem, or Chief of the Revenues of Mecca and Medina, and also of the Interior of the Seraglio. The Mufty Ezade Effendi is deposed, and banished to a Town in Asia, with Orders to repair to Mecca at the proper Season: And his Brother, who was Kadaliskier, or chief Judge of Natolia, is also ordered into Banishment to Synope on the Black Sea; but at the Request of his Creditors is yet here at his own House on the Canal. The Grand Seigneur has made the Person, who was last Year Kadaliskier of Romania, Mufty. The Yesterday or Treasurer has also been deposed, and one in the same Office has succeeded him, and he is banished to Serres near Salonica. The Rebellion, said some Time ago to be begun by Solyman Pascha of Bussora, is confirmed; he actually attacks the Town of Babylon, and his Army increases: Measures are taking to save that Province, and destroy him: Four of the neighbouring Pascha's have Orders to march their Troops to relieve Mehemet Pascha in Babylon. Some think that these Troops cannot arrive in Time, but that Solyman may be Master of the Town before he can be attacked: Others say that he is already in it: The Troops sent are said to be commanded by the Pascha of Sivas. There is certain Advice that the Schach of Persia is sending a Minister here to consolidate the Treaty made with Schach Nadir; and we are assured that the Porte has named a Pascha of Two Tails to go as the Grand Seigneur's Minister in Persia. By the Caravans arrived at Aleppo and Smyrna, there is Advice, that the Disorders of that Kingdom are settled; and it is said here, that Shawrooke Schach is in quiet Possession of the Throne,

having taken Ibrahim Mirza Prisoner, and caused him to be blinded. A great Famine reigns throughout the Kingdom of Persia.

Moscow, August 28. The Right Honourable the Earl of Hyndford, his Britannick Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, had Yesterday his Audience of Leave of her Imperial Majesty, and his Excellency proposes to set out on his Return to England about the Middle of next Month. Baron Hopken, Envoy from Sweden, died here of a Consumption on Saturday last.

Naples, Sept. 9. The King has made a Present of 6000 Ducats to the University of this City. His Majesty being informed that the contagious Distemper still continues to rage very much on the African Coast, and being fearful lest some of the Vessels of that Coast should bring it to the Ports of Tuscany, has sent Orders to the Magistrates of Health to give publick Notice, that no Ship or Vessel whatsoever shall be permitted to unload here, either from Leghorn, or any other of the Ports of Tuscany, without performing their former Quarantine. The Prince de Tarente, their Majesties Second Son, is just seized with the Small Pox.

Stockholm, Sept. 19. Advices from Wennebourg say, that the Prince Successor arrived there on the 8th Instant, and was busy in reviewing their Troops and in examining their Magazines; but that it was expected he would set out on the 11th for Boras.

Vienna, Sept. 20, N. S. The Baron de Becker, the Elector of Palatine's Minister, having finished the Business with which he was charged at this Court, proposes soon to set out on his Return to Manheim. On the 18th Count Durrazzo, Envoy Extraordinary from the Republick of Genoa, had his first publick Audience of their Imperial Majesties at Schonbrun, and delivered his Credential Letters. Count Bentinck, Minister Plenipotentiary from the States General of the United Provinces arrived here Yesterday, and has
