*Dresden, Sept. 22, N. S.* The Prince Royal and the Princess his Spouse are set out on their Journey to Prague.

*Turin, Sept. 24, N. S.* Lady Rochford was presented last Sunday to his Sardinian Majesty at the Venerie, and was received with great Marks of Distinction. His Majesty is reviewing there some of his Regiments. Last Week he reviewed the Duke of Savoy's Regiment of Dragoons, and the Piedmontese Royal Regiment of Dragoons, which is to be given to the Duke of Chablais. Yesterday being the King of Spain's Birth-day, the Spanish Ambassador gave a grand Entertainment, at which were present all the Ministers of State, and foreign Ministers, except the Pope's Nuntio.

*Berlin, Sept. 27, N. S.* On Tuesday last the King, accompanied by Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick, Prince Frederick Eugene de Wurtemberg Stuttgart, and Prince Lobkowitz, together with several Officers of State, General Officers, and Foreign Ministers, set out for Charlottenbourg, where his Majesty gave them a most elegant Entertainment at two Tables in the grand Apartment of the Palace, and in the Evening his Majesty returned to Potsdam.

*Cologne, Sept. 27, N. S.* Count Königsegg, their Imperial Majesties Minister to this Court, is arrived here. We have just received Advice from Steinfort, that the Princess of Nassau Siegen, Spouse of Count Bentheim-Steinfort, was happily delivered there of a Daughter, which had been named Anne-Polixene-Sidonie-Charlotte.

*Copenhagen, Sept. 27, N. S.* The Duke of Saxe Hildbourgshausen is arrived at Fridericksborg, and great Preparations are making for his Marriage with the Princess Louisa, which is to be celebrated next Week at Hirschholm, the Palace of the Queen Dowager. What Stay the Duke proposes to make after his Marriage is not known, but the Prince his Brother, who has accompanied him in his Journey, is, it is said, to remain here, and to enter into the Danish Service. As the Number of Inhabitants here visibly increase, his Danish Majesty has been pleased to give up the Garden and Place of Amalienbourg, situated within the Walls on the East Side of the Town near the Sea, to be built upon for their Use. Favourable Conditions to invite Builders are already published, and the Ground is to be prepared forthwith. There is Room for about one Hundred very convenient Houses, and the Whole, when finished according to the Plan laid down, will be a considerable Addition and Ornament to the City.

*Brussels, Sept. 29, N. S.* Prince Charles of Lorraine is arrived at Ath, where he has been re-

ceived with great Affection; at his Return it is expected he will set out for Mons, and from thence go and visit the Fortifications of Charleroy and Namur.

*Hambourg, Sept. 30, N. S.* The Marquis of Grimaldi, appointed Ambassador from Spain to the Court of Sweden, arrived here last Night with a numerous Retinue.

*Paris, October 1, N. S.* His most Christian Majesty went Yesterday Morning to Choisy, and from thence goes on Thursday to Fontainebleau, where the Infanta stays till Saturday, when she is to proceed on her Journey to Italy to the Infant Don Philip. Prince Frederick of Hesse arrived here last Thursday, and had his Audiences of the King, Queen, and Royal Family Yesterday Morning.

*Hague, October 3, N. S.* On the 1st Instant, his Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, having again assisted at an Assembly of their High Mightinesses, set out in the Evening on his Return to Loo. His Serene Highness has conferred the Degree of Colonel on Lieutenant Colonel d'Aubonne, and has appointed him to be one of his Aids de Camp. Their High Mightinesses have appointed M. de Haren to reside at the Court of Brussels, in the room of M. Kinschot, who is going to reside at Liege as Minister from this State; and 'tis said that Count Wartenleben will be appointed the Republick's Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Sweden. M. d'Ammon, the Prussian Minister, having taken his Leave of this Court by a Memorial, their High Mightinesses have ordered him the usual Present of a Gold Chain and Medal valued at 1300 Florins, together with one of 300 Florins for his Secretary.

*Utrecht, October 3, N. S.* Yesterday Morning his Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, who left the Hague the Night before, passed by this City on his Return to Loo.
