A PROCLAMATION;

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Sixteenth Day of November next; we, with the Advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Sixteenth Day of November next, be held, and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Sixteenth Day of November next.

Given at our Court at Kensington, the Fifth Day of October, 1749, in the Twenty Third Year of our Reign.

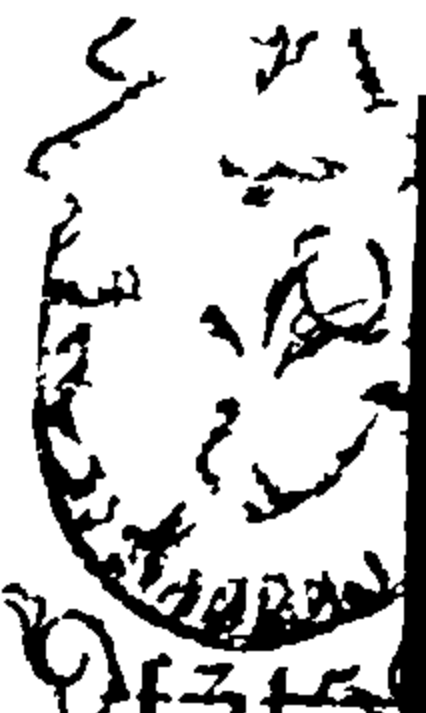
