REPARATIONS are actually making for the Court's Departure for Petersbourg, which feems at prefent to be fixed for the 15th of next Month. For fome Days paft there has fallen a prodigious Quantity of Snow in thefe Parts, and the Froft is now fet in very fevere.

Venice, Nov. 16, N. S. We have just received Advice, that two Corfairs have made themfelves Mafters of a Veffel belonging to this Republick, after an Engagement of more than two Hours, and conducted her to Algiers; the was coming from the Island of Cephalonia, and her loading amounted to a confiderable Value, which makes the Lois of her very fenfibly felt here. Stockholm, Nov. 18. The King feems at prefent much better in Health than he has been for fome Time past, and has affisted very regularly at the feveral Councils which have been lately held. All our Letters from Finland agree, that every Thing is very quiet on the Frontiers, there not having been the least Motion, either in the Ruffian or our Troops, for fome Time pait. Vienna, Nov. 19, N. S. Their Imperial Majefties, with the whole Court, are expected at the Favorite on the 29th Instant from Schonbrun for the Winter. Count Esterhasi is appointed Ambaflador from this Court to that of Madrid, but the Time of his Departure is not yet fixed. Dresden, Nov. 22, N. S. The Feast of St. Elizabeth, of which the Empress Dowager, the Empress of Ruffia, and the Royal and Electoral Princefs, bear the Name, was celebrated at the Palace of St. Hubertsberg on the 19th Instant with great Magnificence; on this Occasion their Majesties received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction. The Count de Malechowski, Great Chancellor of the Crown, has taken his Leave of their Majesties, and is set out on his Return to Poland. Copenhagen, Nov. 22, N. S. The Court fill continues at Christianbourg, from whence the Duke of Holftein Ploen fet out the 10th Instant on his Return home. The King has appointed the Duke of Schleswick Holftein Gluksbourg, Knight of the Order of the Elephant, Major-General of Infantry, and Colonel of the Regiment of Oldenbourg, to be Lieutenant-General of his Majesty's Forces. Hanover, Nov. 25, N. S. The Duke of Saxe Hildbourghausen, with his Spoule the Prin-

cels Louis of Denmark, arrived here from Altena on the 17th Instant, and the next Day continued their Journey for their own Country.

Berlin, Nov, 25, N.S. On the 19th Inftant the Court went into Mourning on Occafion of the Death of the Duke of Holftein Beck, Governor of this City; and on the 23d, the Baron de Hopken fet out from hence on his Return to Drefden. The King has conferred on M. de Montetton, the Rank of Colonel; and his Majefty has likewife appointed him to be Governor of the Fort of Pruffia, near Neifs in Silefia.

Paris, Nov. 28, N. S. The Chevalier de Segur has brought Advice to the King, that the Infanta Dutchess of Parma, and the Infanta Isabella her Daughter, were fafely landed at Genoa on the 6th Instant. On the 24th the King figned the Contract of Marriage between the Marquis de Breze, and Mademoiselle de la Chartre, which Marriage was celebrated the next Day. Hambourg, Nov. 28, N.S. M. de Vos, whom the King of Pruffia has appointed his Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Denmark, is expected here this Evening from Berlin on his Way to Copenhagen. The Senior Counfellor of this City, M. Coldorf, died here last Week, in the Ninety-third Year of his Age, and left an immense Fortune. Hague, Dec. 2, N.S. The Count de Bentheim Steinfort arrived here a few Days ago from Germany. This Morning died M. Jean vander Does, Counfellor and Treasurer-General of the Union, in the 55th Year of his Age. Their High Mightineffes, who still continue their Affembly, have nominated, with the Approbation of the Prince of Orange, the Baron de Wigbolt vander Does, to be Droflart and Intendant of the Digues of the City and Diffricht of Heufden, in the Room of the Baron de Wassenaer Sterrenbourg. By our last Advices from Groninguen, his Serene Highness the Prince of Orange had, at an Affembly of the States of that Province, caufed the new Council to be fworn in ; and having received the Compliments of the Affembly, his Highness proposed to set out as To morrow from thence for Leuwarden.
