## Mofow, December 4.

WITHIN thefe few Days paft, feveral extraordinary Councils have been held at Court, at which her Imperial Majefty and the Grand Prince of Ruffia affifted. The Departure of the Court for Petersbourg is not as yet abfolutely fixed. The Froft continues fet in very fevere, and as a great Quantity of Snow has fallen within thefe three Days paft, the People will foon begin to travel on Sledges.

Stockholm, Dec. 20. The King continues to enjoy a pretty good State of Healih, but as the Weather is now fet in very fevere, bis Majefty confines himfelf to his own Apartment.
Turin, Dec. 20. On Wednefday laft the King came from the Venerie with the whole Court to refide in this City, and the next Day the intended Marriage of the Duke of Savoy, his Majefty's eldeft Son, with the Princefs Dona Marie Antoinette Ferdinande, Infante of Spain, was publickly declared at Court; after which his Majefty and the whole Court went to hear Divine Service performed in the Royal Chapel, which being ended, his Majefty returned to his Apartment, where he received the Compliments of the Nobility, Foreign Minifters, and other Perfons of Diftinction on this Occafion. His Majefty afterwards dined in publick with the Duke of Savoy ; and in the Evening the Spanifh Ambaffador gave a grand Entertainment to many Perfons of Diftinction. At Night there was a Ball at the Palace, and Illuminations throughout the City, which were continued for the two following Nights.
Copenbagen, Dec. 27. On the i 8 th Inftant the Baton de Vofs, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Pruffia, had his firt Audience of his Majefty, and delivered his Credential Letters.
Paris, $\mathcal{D}_{\text {et. 2 2. }}$. The King has deferred bis intended Journey to Choiry for a few Days. Tbe Prince of Conde is happily recovered from the Small Pox. On the 15 th Inftant died the Count de Brabanfon, Goverpor of Coucy; and on the 18 th died the Marquefs d'Ecqueville.

Hague, Fan. 4, N.S. The States of Holland and Weft Friefland will re affemble on Wednefday next. His Serene Highnefs the Prince of Orange has appointed Major Dundas to be Lieutenant Colonel in the Regiment of Lieutenant General Halket.

Hague, Fan. 6, N. S. The Difturbances at Haarlem have been greater than were apprehend + ed. Upon the firft Appearance of a Tumult, a Party of about 50 Dragoons march'd into the Town, but were very foon difmiffed by the Magiftrates. Immediately after their Departure the Mob rofe, fhut the Gates of the Town, where they kept Guard, and affembled to a very great Number in the Market Place, befieging the Magiftrates in the Town Houfe, and making very extravagant Demands, amounting in effect to a Refolution of paying no Taxes at all. 'The Prince of Orange upon this Notice ordered Ge+ neral Cornabe, with a ftrong Detachment of Dutch and Swifs Guards, and fome Cavalry, to march to Haarlem, and fupport the Collectors in the Execution of their Office. The General found the Gate Shut, which having ordered tis Merd to force open, the Burghers fired at them, and wounded one Serjeant ; the Soldiers then were ordered to return the Fire, which immediately drove the Mob from their Poft. The Gate was foon forced open, and the Troops marched up to the Market Place, where another Skirmifh enfued, in which four or five Burghers being killed, and 10 or 12 wounded, the reft retired. The fame Day a Deputation came from Haarlem to the Prince, demanding the Abolition of the Taxes, with many other ridiculous Propofals; but the Prince gave no Anfwer therèto, and committed the Deputies, who are eight in Number, to Prifon. Several of the Ringleaders are taken, and the Prince feems to be rigorous in the Punihment of thofe Offenders ; and a frict Enquiry will be made into the Conduct of the Magiffrates, Things remain quiet at Amfterdam, Rotterdam, and Dort.
