Turin, July 11.

HI S Sardinian Majesty has appointed the Count Sartiran to be his Envoy to the Republick of Genoa. Next Week his Majesty proposes to set out for the Baths of Vaudier, where he thinks to stay about three Weeks.

Turin, July 18. The King of Sardinia set out from hence last Monday to go to the Baths of Vaudier. Since his Majesty's Departure, the Duke of Savoy has received the Foreign Ministers every Day in the King's Apartments, and has likewise transacted the common Business with the Ministers here. The Spanish Ambassadour has received full Powers from his Court, to accept of the Security that is to be given by this Court for the Dutchess's Fortune, and the Province of Coni is said to be the Pledge. The whole Sum is four Millions of Livres of this Country, which amounts to about Two hundred thousand Pounds Sterling?

Lisbon, July 13. The King of Portugal having been seized about a Fortnight ago with a high-Fever, accompanied with delirious Fits, his Physicians thought him in such imminent Danger, that the first Opportunity was laid hold of to administer the last Sacraments to him, and publick Prayers were put up three Days ago for his Majesty in all the Churches and Convents of this City; but his Majesty having rested pretty well last Night, is something better this Morning.

The Commissioners for managing his Majesty's Stamp Duties, having received frequent Informations of several Frauds committed relating to the Duties of Almanacks under their Care, have thought fit to give this publick Notice, That by an Act 9^o Annæ, a Duty of One Penny is granted on every Almanack or Kalendar for any one particular Year, or for any Time less than a Year, printed on one Side of any one Sheet or Piece of Paper, and the Duty of Two Pence for every other Almanack or Kalendar for any one particular Year; and if any Almanack or Kalendar shall be made to serve for several Years, the said Duties are made payable for every such Year (but the same is not to extend to charge any Kalendar or perpetual Almanack in any Bible or Common Prayer Book, or any other Kalendar or Almanack, with more than the Duty that would be payable for such Kalendar or Almanack, in Case it were made for three Years only) under the Penalty of Ten Pounds for every Person writing, ingrossing, printing, selling, or exposing to Sale, any such Almanack before the same shall appear to be duly Stampd. That by an Act 10^o Annæ, the ascertaining and securing the said Duties, it is enacted, That all Books and Pamphlets serving chiefly to the Purpose of an Almanack, by whatsoever Name or Names intituled or described, are charged with the said Duties. The Commissioners do hereby give this further Notice, that they will prosecute with the utmost Severity, all such as shall be found offending against this Law.
