

Dresden, Oct. 25. Their Majesties and the whole Court propose setting out on Friday next for Hubertsbourg, where they intend to stay some Time. On Tuesday last M. Calkoen, Minister Plenipotentiary from the States General of the United Provinces, had his first private Audience of his Majesty, and delivered his Credential Letters; after which he had an Audience of the Queen; and on Thursday M. de Malshan, the new Prussian Minister, had likewise his first private Audience of their Majesties.

Hague, Oct. 30. Lord Anson and Lord De La War arrived here the Night before last: They had landed that Evening at Helvoetsluys from on Board the Squadron which is to convoy his Majesty to England. The Prince Stadtholder has lately published a Proclamation, for the better preventing the Plundering of Ships, which may have the Misfortune to be wreck'd on the Isle of Ameland, situate near the Coast of Friesland, and belonging to his Serene Highness. Count Bentinck and M. De Larroy, set out for Loo on Wednesday last. M. Kinschot, late the Republick's Resident at Brussels, is returned to the Hague.

Hague, Nov. 3. His Grace the Duke of Newcastle, who has been here these two Days, proposes to set out To-morrow for Brussels, where his Dutchess is waiting for him; from whence they will proceed to Calais, in order to embark on Board the Fubbs Yatch for England. By Advices from Hanover we learn, that the King of Great Britain intends leaving that Place on Monday next, the 9th Instant, on his Return to England, so that his Majesty is expected at Helvoetsluys on the Friday following. Yesterday the Anniversary of the Princess of Orange's Birth-day was celebrated here with great Rejoycings; in the Morning the Cannon were fired; and in the Evening most of the Houses were prettily illuminated. On this Occasion M. de Rambouillet, one of the Gentlemen of her Royal Highness's Bed-Chamber, gave a very elegant Entertainment, at which were present several Persons of the first Distinction. They write from Loo, that their Serene Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Orange have fixed their Departure for this Place for the 15th Instant.
