

Berlin, Nov. 8. The King, accompanied by Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick, and a numerous Retinue of General Officers, arrived here on Thursday last from Potzdamm, and gave Audience to some Foreign Ministers; after which he dined with the Queen-Mother, and the next Morning returned to Potzdamm.

Hague, Nov. 14. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland renewed their Deliberations this Morning. The Deputies from the Province of Overysfel, who have been here for some Days, having executed the Commission with which they were charged, are set out on their Return Home. They write from Schoonhoven, that her Royal Highness the Princess Governante having been pleased to approve of the Nomination that was presented to her of Magistrates for that Place for the Year ensuing, those Magistrates were accordingly installed on Friday last with the usual Ceremonies.
