Naples, March 13.

THE two Men of War that failed from hence a few Days ago, and which were obliged by violent Storms to return into Port, put to Sea again Yesterday Morning on a Cruize against the Barbary Pyrates, who greatly interrupt the Navigation all along the Coast of this Kingdom.

Leghorn, March 15. We are informed by our last Advices from Bastia, that the Chiefs of the Malecontents of the Island of Corfica continue to assemble, in order to agree upon some Form of Government, and how to behave to the Genoese after the French Forces have left that Island; and although nothing was absolutely determined, yet it is generally believed that their Intention is to renew the War. And by Letters from Genoa we hear, that the Chevalier de Chauvelin, Minister Plenipotentiary from France to that Republick, only waits for an Account of the Embarcation of the French Troops from Corfica, before he sets out for Turin, at which Court he is appointed to replace the Marquess des Issarts, who, on Account of his ill State of Health, has solicited and obtained his Letters of Revocation.

Rome, March 17. On Tuesday last died here Cardinal Antoine-Xavier-Gentili, in the 72d Year of his Age. The Hereditary Prince of Anspach is still here, and employs himself daily in viewing the Curiosities of this City.

Parma, March 19. Orders are sent to Colorno for repairing and getting ready the Apartments for the Reception of the Infant Duke our Sovereign, who proposes to spend great Part of the Summer at that Palace.

Toulon, March 21. The armed Frigate, and twenty Transports, that have been equipping in this Port, in order to fetch the French Troops from Corfica; are now ready, and only wait the Return of a Courier from Versailles, before they put to Sea.

Prague, March 24. 'Tis confidently reported, that the Troops quartered in this Kingdom will form a Camp in the Summer, under the Command of Prince Piccolomini.

Vienna, March 25. On Monday last, being the Feast of St. Joseph, whose Name the eldest Archduke bears, their Imperial Majesties received the Compliments of the Nobility and Gentry on that Occasion, and afterwards dined in Publick. The next Day the Emperor, accompanied by some of the principal Lords of the Court, set out for Stammerstorff, in order to take the Diversion of Hunting in that Neighbourhood.

Copenhagen, March 26. Preparations are making at Court for celebrating the King's Birthday on Saturday next; and on the 5th of next Month the Court will remove to Fredensbourg. The King having approved of the Plan for erecting a new Port at the Point of Niebo, they are going to begin the same immediately.

Stockholm, March 27. The Commissioners of the Admiralty have, at the Request of the French Ambassador, sent several Divers and others to the Island of Aland, in order to recover what they can of the Cargo of a French Ship that foundered off that Island in December last.

Munich, March 28. The Elector of Cologne, who has been here for these three Weeks past, proposes to set out next Wednesday on his Return Home.

Berlin, March 31. The King has given the Command of the Castle of Regenstein, in the Principality of Halberstadt, to M. Ramcke, heretofore Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment of Foot of Borck. Last Tuesday, being the Anniversary of the Birth of the Queen-Mother, who then entred into the 67th Year of her Age, the same was celebrated at Court with great Magnificence; the King came himself from Potzdam, with a great Retinue of General Officers, &c. on Purpose to compliment her on that Occasion, and did not return till the next Morning. We have received Advice, that M. de Voltaire, who set out from hence some Days ago for Leipzick, is seized with a dangerous Disorder. By our last Letters from the New Marche we are informed, that the Village, and beautiful House of Neupelzig, belonging to M. Schack, were both destroyed by a dreadful
