Dires, Nov. 6. The advices we receive from France and Spain of the pollure of the Armies in Roufelton, differ to very thich, that we know not what to eredit; the French write, that the Spanisods were cer-Bainly regreated, with intentions, as was thought, to thip part of their Forces on the Durch Men of War. Commanded by Lieutenant-Admiral Tromp, to be fent to the affiffance of the Viceroy of Sici y, but from Madrid of the 4 inflant they tell us, that a Courier was arrived there with Letters of the 23 of September, from their Army, giving an account, That the 22 of the fame month the Duke of St. Germain, Who was encamped on the River Tech, near Morillus, being informed that the Duke of Schinberg had fent 400 Men to Convoy Provisions to the Caffle of Bageas, with Orders afterwards to march to Villa Franca, Immediately Commanded Captain Rodado to march with some Troops to intercept the faid Convoy, but notwithstanding the great diligence the said Captain used, the Prenel got into Bagnos, before the Spamards could come up with them, they therefore refol vell to warch their return, which they did very fucersfully, for having attacked them, after a brisk disputes 80 or 70 of the French were killed, and 240 taken prisoners, and 180 Mules, which had carried the Proviof Scomberg, for what reason they knew nor, quirted His Chip, and retreated towards Eina, with great di-Higerice; and that the Duke of St. Germains upon adfibe of it, fent a Party of Horse to midel elieir Rear,

which they did, and returned with feveral prisoners and 300 Mules they had taken, and presently after the Duke of St. Germain likewife decamped, and marched directly towards Villa Franca 3 the 24, St. Fuan de Pases, in which the French had put 100 Men, furrendred upon Summons.

Park, Nov. 7. According to our last advices from Alfatia, we may well conclude that the Troops which were fent by the Prince of Conde from Flanders, are by this time joyned with Montieur de Tu-reame, who will then march against the Confederates, and endeavour to engage them in a Battel, though the Letters we have from soussburg cell us, they are already recreated, and refolved, through the want they behin to fullain of Forage and Providens, to go into Whiter Quarters ; but some Letters Tay, that their retheat is occasioned through the difference and jealousie among the Generals, which is come to that point, as that they feel to suspect some among themselves. to hold correspondence with the Enemy, and that effereupon the Elector of Brandenburg had declared, his refolution to march home again with his Army. he plainly forefreing that nothing could be done, till; the Conduct of Matters was in fewer and other hands; of which we must expect, till our next Letters from: those pares, to be more certainly informed. The Procels against the Chevalier de Rohan, now prisoner in the Baftille, is not yet finished, but will be very suddain'y, The Baron Sparr, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Crown of Sweden, is arrived here from England, and yesterday had a private Audience of the King at St. Germains.
