By the KING's PATENT.

HIS Majesty having been graciously pleased to grant His Royal Letters Patent, bearing Date at Westminster the 21<sup>st</sup> Day of May 1754, unto John Lewis, Merchant, in Plymouth, for his new invented Varnish of Pine, prepared from the Glutinous Juices of the American Pitch Pine Tree, proved by many Experiments made in His Majesty's Dock Yards, and many other private Docks, to be the cheapest and best Preparation for Paying Ships Sides and Masts, and for preserving Ships and Timber Buildings from the Weather, from the Worm, and from Decay of any Thing yet known. It is very tenacious and penetrating, and intirely free from that saline acid Water which is found in Turpentine in great Quantities; it will never turn White after Rain, but continue always of a bright Amber Colour, and very transparent; it must be laid on cold with a Brush, which may be done at Sea as well as in Harbour; and is of the Consistency of Linseed Oyl, boiled down very thick, and quite as smooth.—One Hundred Weight is sufficient to pay the Sides and Masts of a Ship of 250 Tons: This is therefore to acquaint the Publick, that the said Varnish is sold by the Patentee at Plymouth, and by Mr. Alexander French, Ship-Chandler, at Rotherhitth.
