IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in his Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, the Honourable Sir Henry Bellenden, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ei ty Six, and for the Relief of the Inhabitants of the City and County of the City of Lintoln, in respect of Arrears of the Land Tax.

An Ast for punishing Mutiny and Defertion,

and for the better Payment of the Army and their

Quarter's.

An Act for explaining and amending two Acts of Parliament, one made in the Eleventh Year of His Majesty's Reign, (for repairing the Road from Shoreditch Church through Hackney to Stanford Hill, and cress Cambridge Heath over Bethnall Green to the Turnpike at Mile End in the County of Middlesex) and the other made in the Twenty fixth Year of His Majesty's Reign (for enlarging the Term and Powers granted by the said former Ast) and for empowering the Trustees to erest and maintain Lamps, and keep a Guard upon the said Roads in the Night Time, An Ast for enlarging the Cometery or Church Yard of the Parish of Saint Mary Newington Butts, in the County of Surry.

Whereas by His Majesty's Proclamation, bearing Date the Eleventh Day of November last, "For recalling and prohibiting Seamen 45 from ferving Foreign Princes and States; for giving Encouragement to Seamen and Able-bedied Landmen, to enter themselves on Board 46 His Majesty's Ships of War; for granting 66 Rewards for discovering such Seamen as shall conceal themselves; and also for taking up all for Straggling Seamen; His Majesty was gracioully pleased to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under

the Age of Twenty Years i and also that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, hot above the Age of Therty five, not under the Age of Twenty Years, should be paid to every such Seaman and Landman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirty first Day of this Instant December, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation; as likewise that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman; should be paid to any Perfort who should, on or before the faid Thirty first Day of this Instant, dilcover any Seaman, or Seamen, who should conceal themselves, so that fuch Seaman, or Seamen, should be taken for His Majesty's Service: And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is how near expiring and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fathe should be continued for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order. and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the Time limited by the fald Proclamation, for Page ment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be pro-longed and extended from the faid Thirty First Day of this Instant December, to the Thirty First Day of January next Inclusive. And that the faid respective Bounties and Rewards be continued to be paid by the Persons, and at the Times, directed by His Majesty's aforelaid Pro-W. Sharpe.
