The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by His Majefty's Proclamation, bearing Date the Eleventh Day of November laft, "For resalling and prohibiting Seamen * from ferving Foreign Princes and States; for " giving Encouragement to Seamen and Able-* bodied Landmen, to enter themfelves on Board " His Majefty's Ships of War; for granting " Rewards for discovering fuch Seamen as shall " conceal themfelves ; and alfo for taking up all " Straggling Seamen ;" His Majefty was gracioully pleafed to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and alfo that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fnould be puil to every fuch Seaman and Landman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirty first Day of this Instant December, voluntarily enter themselves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation ; as likewife that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twency Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be plid to any Perfon who fhould, on or before the faid Thirty first Day of this Instant, difcover any Seaman, or Seamen, who should conceal themfeives, fo that fuch Seaman, or Seamen, fhould be taken for His Majefty's Service : And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame fhould be continued for fome longer Time; His Majesty, with the Ad-

vice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order; and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the Time limited by the faid Proclamation, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty First Day of this Inftant December, to the Thirty First Day of January next inclusive. And that the faid respective Bounties and Rewards be continued to be paid by the Perfons, and at the Tintes, directed by His Majesty's aforelaid Proclamation; W. Sharpe.
