

Cologne, Jan. 4. We hear from Mun-
 fler, that the States are summoned to meet on
 Friday next the 9th Instant, in order to con-

 pany in the Infantry, and 15 in the Cavalry of
 the Troops of that Country.

Brussels, Jan. 6. Our last Advices from the

 Sea Coasts upon the Ocean, from Dunkirk to
 Bayonne. As is also the Duke of Richelieu of
 all the Coasts upon the Mediterranean.
