\*TIS with the fincerest Duty that your Majefty's loyal Subjects the Mayor, Corporation and Burgefles of Taunton, approach your Royal Perfon at this critical Conjuncture ; as it is with the utmost Pleasure that we have observed your Majefty's truly paternal Care over us in numberless Instances; and particularly in the Measures which you have taken to guard our Rights and our Trade from the perfidious Incroachments of our inveterate Enemies. As it is our Duty (fenfible how much we enjoy beyond neighbouring Nations) not merely to forbear obstructing your Government by unreasonable Oppositions, but to be actively loyal; fo we promife all that free and dutiful Subjects owe to the best of Kings, and, with our Lives and Fortunes, will fupport and defend our Sovereign, by whom we have been fo long protected from Arbitrary Power, Oppression, and Popery.

Given under our Common Seal, this 19th Day of April, 1756.

Warface, April 3. We are informed by out last Letters from the Ukraine, that the Hayducks continue to make Incursions into that Province.

Stockholm, April 3. The Weather continues fo fevere in this Country, that the Navigation upon all our Rivers and Lakes is still interrupted by the great Quantities of Ice floating in We hear that fome flight Shocks of att them. Earthquake have been lately felt in the Province of Jempteland, on the Frontiers of Norway, which alarmed the Inhabitants, but did no confiderable Damage.

Copenhagen, April 10. This Day their Majefties, and the Princels Charlotte Amelia, fet out for Friedensbourg. The King has caufed an Ordonnance to be published, forbidding the Officers of his Forces to enter into the Service of any Foreign Power without his Permiffion.

Vienna, April 10. On Thuifday Morning last a grand Council was held at the Palace, at which their Imperial Majefties affifted. After which the Emperor fet out with a numerous Retinue for Schlofhof.

Venice. April 14. We hear from Rome that the following Promotion of Cardinals was made by the Pope in the Confistory on the 5th In fant, viz, Giovanni Battifta Royero, Archbishop of Turin; Francis Corrado Baron de Rodt, Bishop of Constans; Prince Joseph Trautzen, Archbishop of Vienna; Nicolas de Saulx de Tavannes, Bishop of Roen; Paul d'Albert de Lu nes, Bishop of Sens; Stephen Renato Po ier de Gesures, Bifliop of Beauvais : Francis di solis Folch de Cardona, Archbishop of Sevil; Francis de Saldanha de Gama, Principal of the Patriarchate of Lisbon; Alberico Archinto, Archbishop of Nice and Governor of Rome. In the Night of the 12th Inftant a fmall Shock of an Earthquake was felt here, about Eight o'Clock Yesterday Morning a fecond, and about Ten in the Evening a third.

Berlin, April 15. The King has appointed Major Schulenbourg to be one of the Council of the Regency of Magdebourg, in the Room of M. Veldheim, who has obtained his Majefty's On Monday last the Permiffion to refign. Princess Amelia, the King's Sifter, was installed Abbels of Quedlinbourg, with all the Pomp

and Magnificence usual on the like Occasions. Brussels, April 20. According to the Ad-vices we received Yesterday from Paris, an Exprefs was arrived at Verfailles with an Account that the Fleet and the Troops under the Command of the Duke de Richelieu, intended against the Island of Minorca, failed from Toulon on the 12th Inftant. Comte Lalaing, Governot of Bruges, died here the Day before Yesterday in an advanced Age. The Reigning Duke of Mecklenbourg-Schwerin arrived here a few Days ago from France.
