I.S Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, the Honourable Sir Henry Bellenden, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was feut with a Meffage from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of The Commons being come thither ac Peers. cordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to

An Act for granting to His Majefly certain Sums of Money out of the Sinking Fund, and applying certain Monies remaining in the Exche quier, for the Service of the Year One thou, and Jeven bundred and fifty fix.

An Act for enabling His Majesty to raise One Million for the Purpose therein mentioned, and for further appropriating the Supplies granted in this Seffion of Parliament.

An AEt for further continuing an AEt of the fixth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, For fecuring and encouraging the Trade of His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America; to indemnify Commissioners of the Land Tax for Counties at large and Ridings, who have acted by Virtue of Leafehold Eftates; and to obviate a Doubt relating to the Qualification of Commissioners of the Land Tax for the City and Liberty of Westminster.

An Act for the Encouragement of Seamen, and the more speedy and effectual Manning His Majefty's Navy.

An Act for the better Recruiting of His Majesty's Forces on the Continent of America, and for the better Regulation of the Army, and preventing Defertion there.

An Act for extending the Act of the Twentyfecond Year of His prefent Majesty, For amending, explaining, and reducing into one Act of Parliament, the Laws relating to the Govern-ment of His Majesly's Ships, Veffels, and Forces by Sea, to fuch Officers, Seamen, and others, as shall serve on Board His Majesty's Ships or Vesfels employed upon the Lakes, great Waters, or Rivers in North America.

An Act for reviving and continuing an Act For the Relief of Dobtors, with Respect to the Im-prisonment of their Persons; and for continuing an Act, made in the last Session of Parliament, To continue feveral Laws relating to the Diftemper now razing among the Horned Cattle in this Kingdom.

An Act to render more effectual an Act, passed in the twelfth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George, to prevent unlawful Combinations of Workmen employed in the Woollen Manufactures, and for better Payment of their Wages; and also an Ast paffed in the thirteenth Year of

the Reign of his faid late Majesty, for the better Regulation of the Woollen Manufasture, and for preventing Disputes among the Persons concerned therein, and for limitting a Time for prosecuting for the Forfeiture appointed by the aforefaid Act, in Cafe of the Payment of the Workmen's Wages in any other Manner than in Money.

An Act for encouraging the Fisheries, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland.

Au Act for inclosing, by the mutual Confent of the Lord and Tenants, Part of any Common for the Purpole of planting and preferving Trees fit for Timber or Underwood, and for more effectually preventing the unlawful Dest uction of Trees.

An Act jor more effectually discouraging, and preventing the Stealing, and the buying and receiving of Stolen Lead, Iron, Copper, Brafs, Bell Metal and Solder, and for more effectually bringing the Offenders to Justice.

An AEt to enable Injants. Lunaticks, and Femes Covert, to furrender Leajes, in order to renew the fame.

An ACT for appointing a fuffi ient Number of Constables for the Service of the City and Liberty of Westminster; and to compel proper Persons to take upon them the Office of Jurymen, to present Nufances and other Öffences, within the faid City and Liberty.

An ASI to enable the Commissioners for building a Bridge cross the River Thames, from the City of Westminster to the opposite Shore in the County of Surry, to purchase Houses and Grounds, and to widen the Ways and make more safe and com-modious the Streets, Avenues, and Passages leading from Charing Crofs to the two Houses of. Parliament, Westminster Hall, and the Courts of Justice there, and Westminster Bridge, and to enable a lefs Number of Commiffioners to execute the fe-veral Asis relating to the faid Bridge, than at prefent are required by Law; and for Relief of George and James King, with regard to a Leafe taken by their late Father from the faid Com-. missers.

An Act for explaining, amending, and rendering more effectual an Act, made in the Twenty. fecond Year of his prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, An AEI for making a free Market for the Sale of Fish in the City of Westminster, and for preventing the forestalling and monopolizing of Fish, and for allowing the Sale of Fish under the Dimensions mentioned in a Clause contained in an Ast of the first Year of his late Majesty's Reign, in Case the same are taken with a Hook.

An Act for regulating the Proceedings in per-Ional Actions in the Courts Baron of the Manors of Sheffield and Ecclefall, in the County of York:
